Introduction

The **ECCO FEI World Championships 2022 in Herning** (DEN), scheduled for 6 to 14 August, brings together 458 top-level **Jumping, Dressage, Para Dressage and Vaulting** athletes and 379 elite horses in a bid to claim the ultimate the title of World Champion.

During the 10 days of competition, **200,000 equestrian enthusiasts** will pack the different venues, while **150 million viewers** will follow the action from all over the world.

FEI World Championships: 69 years of top-class equestrian history

The legacy of FEI World Championships spans decades, starting with Jumping in 1953, held in the iconic Parc des Princes, with 19 athletes on the start list representing 11 nations. The FEI World Jumping Championships have been held regularly every four years since 1966 in between Olympic Games editions (prior to that it was more sporadic – ie 1953, 1954, 1955, 1956, 1960).

The first FEI Dressage World Championship was held in 1966 in Bern (SUI), with 24 Athletes from six nations competing for the coveted title – and would go on to be held regularly every four years.

For Vaulting and Para Dressage, their first World Championships were held a couple of decades later, after becoming FEI disciplines in 1983 and 2006 respectively. Bern (SUI) was host to the first FEI Vaulting World Championship in 1986 attracting 51 athletes from 14 nations and has been held every two years since then with every other edition (1990, 1994, 1998, 2002, 2006, 2010, 2014, and 2018) held as part of the **FEI World Equestrian Games™ (WEG)**. The WEG were held every four years from 1990 to 2018 with the first edition in Stockholm (SWE) attracting 421 athletes from 35 nations.

Meanwhile, for Para Dressage, becoming an FEI discipline in 2006 would open to the door to World Championships in 2007, held as a standalone event in Hartpury (GBR) before joining the WEG programme and held consistently every four years from 2010.

For 2022 and following a thorough bid process for individual and multisport World Championships, the FEI selected three venues to host the World Championships 2022:

- **ECCO FEI World Championships 2022 in Herning (DEN)** featuring Jumping, Dressage, Para Dressage and Vaulting
- **FEI World Championships 2022 in Pratoni del Vivaro (ITA)** featuring Eventing and Driving
- **FEI Endurance World Championship 2022 in Verona (ITA)**
- featuring Endurance

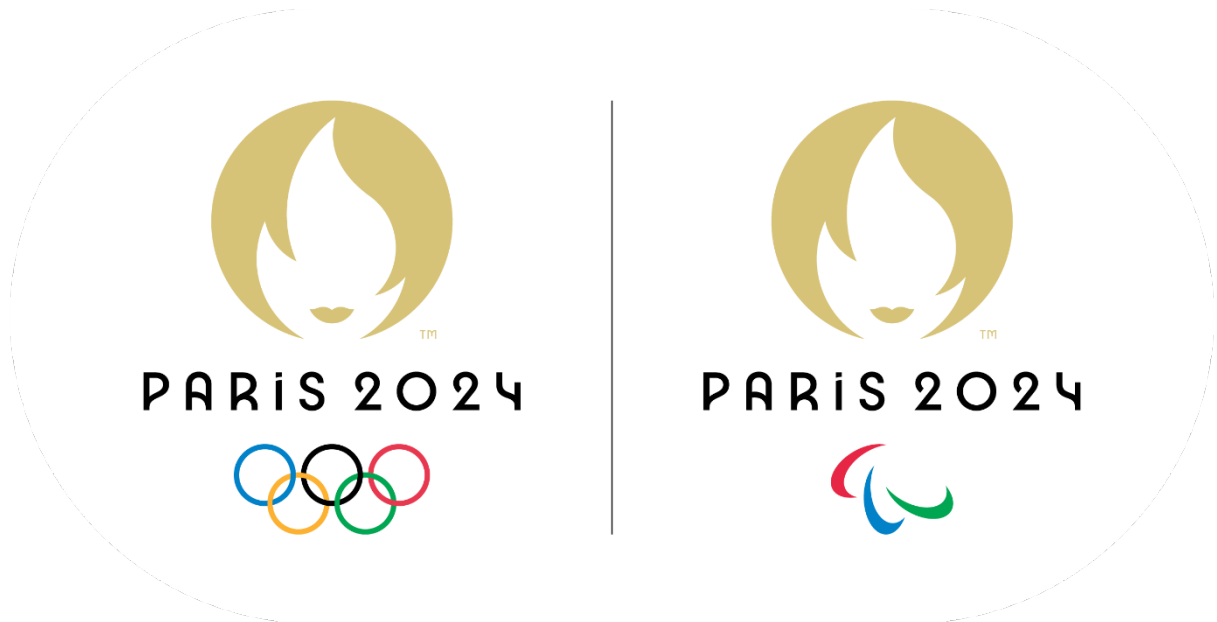
The rationale to subdivide the Championships 2022, and based on the bids received, was to ensure the facilities and conditions could meet the needs of each

discipline – with each venue having a proven track record - and providing the FEI with a more flexible approach in the allocation process.

Road to Paris 2024



The FEI World Championships 2022 will provide the first qualifying opportunity for the Paris **2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games**. **In Herning, this includes:**

- **Jumping:** the five (5) highest ranked teams from the Agria FEI Jumping World Championship 2022 in Herning (10 – 14 August 2022) excluding the host country team. (Max 15 Athletes)
- **Dressage:** the six (6) highest ranked teams from the Blue Hors FEI Dressage World Championship 2022 in Herning (6-10 August 2022) excluding the host country team. (Max 18 Athletes)
- **Para Dressage:** the top seven (7) ranked teams (not including the host country) at the Orifarm Healthcare FEI Para Dressage World Championship 2022 in Herning (10-14 August 2022) will each obtain four (4) qualification slots for their National Paralympic Committee (NPC). (28 Athletes)

About the venue for the ECCO FEI World Championships 2022

The city of Herning will host the **ECCO FEI World Championships 2022**, with three main areas dedicated to the different Championships:

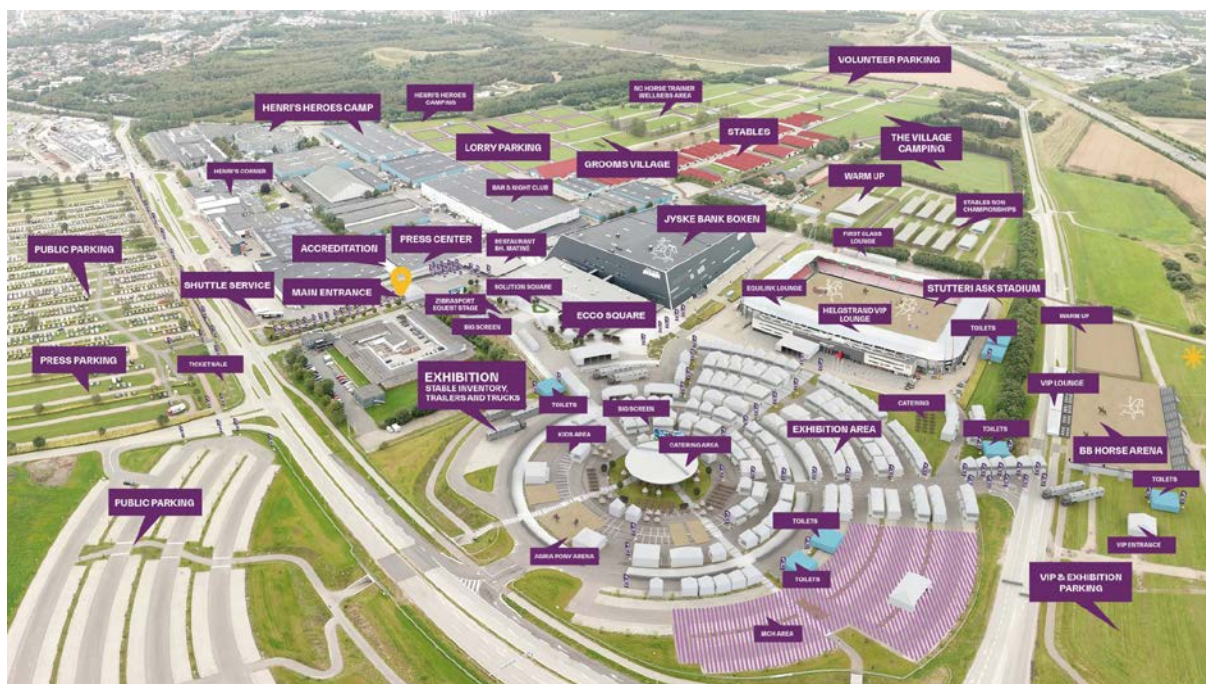
Stutteri Ask Stadium: The Jumping and Dressage competitions will be held at the Stutteri Ask Stadium, a football stadium with a capacity of 10,000 seated guests.

Jyske Bank: This indoor arena can welcome 5,000 seated guests who will enjoy the Vaulting competitions.

BB Horse Arena: For the Para Dressage, a new stadium has been built from scratch for the occasion with capacity for 2,200 spectators.

A total of 200,000 spectators are expected to attend during the 10 days of competition.

Two athletes – one male and one female - have won **individual gold twice**: **Hans Günter Winkler (GER)** in 1954 and 1955 and **Janou Tissot (FRA)** in 1970 and 1974.

Germany is the team with most medals with 41. The **Netherlands** is second (14) and **Switzerland** is third (10).

Youngest Medallist: Marion Janice Coakes (GBR) - 18 years old

Oldest Medallist: Laura Kraut (GER) - 53 years old

Chinese Jumping athlete **Ella Yunjing Wang** and Indian Dressage athletes **Anush Agarwalla and Shruti Vora** will be pioneers for their nations in these disciplines

France is the team with most medals with 20. **Germany** is second (19) and **Great Britain** is third (18).

Youngest Individual Medallist: Nicole Uphoff-Selke (GER) - 23 years old

Oldest Individual Medallist: Klaus Balkenhol (GER) - 55 years old

Dressage athletes **Carrie Schopf** of Armenia and Moldova's **Alisa Glinka** are both making history for their nations, as is Dominican Republic's two-time Olympian, **Yvonne Losos De Muniz** by representing their nations for the first time in a FEI World Championship.

First FEI Vaulting World Championship: 1986 in Bulle (SUI) Team vs squad

Since the start of the FEI Vaulting World Championship in 1986, the groups of vaulters competing together were referred to as teams. In 2011, the FEI General Assembly approved a rule change according to which the former teams would be referred to as "squads". At the World Championships, squads competed for the first time in Le Mans (FRA) in 2012. According to the FEI Vaulting Rules, a Vaulting squad is composed of a lunger, horse, and six vaulters.

An Official Team Competition, consisting of a free test, was introduced at the FEI World Equestrian Games™ 2018 and has been in use at FEI Vaulting World Championships and FEI Vaulting European Championships for Seniors since then.

The Official Teams consist of three competitive units: two individuals, regardless of whether they are male or female, and a squad.

Jasmine Lidner (AUT) and **Janika Derks** (GER) are the athletes who have won the most World Championship medals with a total of 7 each. (Lidner has 5 golds and Derks has 3 golds).

Germany is the team with most medals with 88. **Austria** is second (21) and **USA** is third (19).

Youngest Medallist: Mona Pavetic (GER) - 9 years old

Oldest Medallist: Petr Eim (CZE) - 44 years old

France, Australia and Finland are each entering Vaulting teams for the first time.
