Sanction for Non-Compliance on Self-Certification

According to the temporary provisions put in place for the return to competition in mainland Europe post-EHV-1, it is mandatory for the Athlete/groom to provide a signed FEI self-certification of health status for all horses being presented at the Examination on Arrival, including mandatory temperature monitoring charts for the 10 days leading up to the event.

The sanction for non-compliance on self-certification: Fine of CHF 400 per horse.

The sanction is to be issued by the President of the Ground Jury (acting upon the advice of the Veterinary Delegate) and information about the fine (Name and FEI ID of the Athlete and Horse) should be recorded under "Comments, follow up and improvements" on the online Veterinary Report, along with any other comments/feedback on EHV-1 related items (e.g. failure to provide proof of a negative PCR test (if required), issues with the biosecurity measures in place on site). The FEI Veterinary Department will then do the necessary follow up and issue the invoice(s) through the Athletes/grooms' National Federations.
