FEI Driving World Ranking Scale of points





Generals:

The list for the FEI Driving World Ranking takes into account the points obtained by Athletes over a twelve month period beginning on 1 January and ending on 31 December.

The list for the FEI Driving World Ranking begins on 1 January each year with the carryover of the total number of points which have been accumulated during the previous year until 31 December.

At the end of each month, the points earned during that month are added to the list. The points from the same month the previous year are dropped from the list.

Points obtained at Games and Championships are retained on the list depending on the frequency of the Events. If the Event is held every four years, 25% of the points obtained are dropped after one year, 50% after two years, 75% after three years and the remainder after four years. If the Event is held every two years, 50% of the points obtained are dropped after one year and the remainder after two years.

Athletes may request a maternity leave or a medical leave providing the pregnancy/medical condition is certified in writing by a medical doctor; requests for maternity/medical leave must be addressed to the FEI Driving Director. During the period which an Athlete has officially ceased to compete due to pregnancy or a medical condition, he/she will retain 50% of the Rankings points earned from the corresponding month of the preceding year until he/she recommences competing internationally. The minimum length of time for which an Athlete may be granted a maternity/medical leave is six months; if the maternity/medical leave lasts less than six months, no points will be retained from the corresponding month of the preceding year. The maximum length of time an Athlete may benefit from a maternity/medical leave of absence at one time is twelve months. During the period in which an Athlete is on maternity/medical leave, he/she may not compete in international or national Competitions; the FEI will inform the Athlete's NF accordingly. The Athlete concerned must inform the FEI Driving Director when he/she resumes international participation.

Point System:

All CAI 3^* , CAIO 4^* , CH-M and FEI Driving World CupTM results will count throughout the year, according to the table below.

Note:

During 2020 the monthly ranking points from the 2019 Ranking will not count, as it is the first year of the FEI Driving World Ranking.

Additional points based on Individual Rankings are awarded for the different Championships, FEI Driving World Cup™ qualifying events and CAIOs as follows:

World Equestrian Games: 15 points
World Championships: 10 points
World Cup Qualifiers: 5 points
CAIO4* 5 points

Clarification: For World Cup Qualifiers that are CAIO4*, only 5 additional points will be awarded.

No points will be awarded to Wild Cards for avoidance of any doubts.

When calculating the number of Athletes that competed in the leg the Wild Cards will count.

^{*}For the FEI Driving World Cup^{TM} , only the eligible Top 10 Drivers will collect points, provided they complete the legs (Competition 2).
