

Definition of Harassment and Abuse

- Harassment and abuse can be expressed in 5 forms which may occur <u>in combination</u> or <u>in</u> isolation. These include
 - i) Psychological abuse
 - ii) Physical abuse
 - iii) Sexual harassment
 - iv) Sexual abuse, and
 - v) Neglect.

i) Psychological abuse

Any unwelcome act, such as

- Verbal assault
- Humiliation
- Intimidation



ii) Physical abuse

Any deliberate and unwelcome act that causes physical trauma or injury, such as

- Punching
- Beating
- Kicking

Such act can also consist of forced doping practices



iii) Sexual Harassment

Any unwanted and unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature, whether verbal, non-verbal or physical.



iv) Sexual Abuse

Any conduct of a sexual nature, whether non-contact, contact or penetrative, where consent is coerced / manipulated or is not or cannot be given.



v) Neglect

The failure of a coach or another person with a duty of care towards the athlete to provide a minimum level of care to the athlete, which is causing harm, allowing harm to be caused, or creating an imminent danger of harm.



Harassment and abuse can be based on any grounds including

- Race
- Religion
- Ethnic origin
- Physical attributes
- Gender
- Sexual orientation
- Disability



Harassment and abuse can be

- A one-off incident
- A series of incidents
- In person
- Online
- Deliberate
- Unsolicited
