### 2. SPORTS FORUM

The Sports Forum held in Lausanne in April was a successful opportunity for the equestrian community to get together. We presented the main proposed changes to the Endurance Rules and there were good exchanges and useful discussions with the NFs and Stakeholders. The creation of a working group (named The Vet Gate Working Group) between Endurance Officials and Veterinarians came out of the Sports Forum's request to look into more scientific data ahead of Horse Welfare driven rule changes.

#### 3. FULL RULE REVISION

Much of the Committee's work this year has been undertaking a full rules revision for 2024. The Technical Committee with the Endurance Department has looked at issues that needed change and clarification for the 2024 full rule revision, together with suggestions from NFs which have been considered and evaluated. We have proposed modifications for better comprehension and implementation in 2024 while maintaining horse welfare considerations.

#### 4. RANKING LIST

A new way of calculating the Ranking List has been created to allow a more accurate ranking of the Endurance riders around the world. Simulations were carried out at the FEI headquarters with the technical support of the Technology and Sport Services department and the Endurance Department.

#### 5. VET GATE WORKING GROUP

A Vet-Endurance Working Group with various top FEI equine veterinarians was created to focus on improving the effectiveness of veterinary inspections, to identify early signs of metabolic problems, and to investigate evidence to support rule changes. This will include modifications to the minimum Mandatory Out Of Competition Periods between two rides in relation to the speed and the distance completed as well as investigating weight loss for Horses during competition, and studying the Athlete/weight ratio.

#### 6. HYPOSENSITIVITY TEST

The Hyposensitivity Control Teams, under the direction of the FEI Veterinary Department, have been testing horses in various Endurance competitions on different continents at 43 venues. A total of 2'665 Horses were tested and 10 (0,37 %) did not pass and were Disqualified. The testing was also used at all the FEI Endurance Championships. Endurance stakeholders are now familiar with this new testing procedure, and we receive very positive feedback.
