4.	A new way of calculating the Ranking Lists was put in place in 2024 to allow a more accurate ranking of Endurance Riders and Combinations around the world. At the end of this year, we will see the results of this new Ranking calculation.  VET GATE WORKING GROUP
	A Vet-Endurance Working Group with various top FEI equine veterinarians was created in 2023 to focus on improving the effectiveness of veterinary inspections to identify early signs of metabolic problems and to investigate evidence to support future rule changes. Work is underway.
5.	HYPOSENSITIVITY TEST
	The Hyposensitivity Control Teams, under the direction of the FEI Veterinary Department, tested horses in various Endurance competitions on different continents at 16 venues. A total of 1205 horses were tested and 6 (0,5 %) did not pass and were Disqualified. The testing was also used at all the FEI Endurance Championships. Endurance stakeholders are now familiar with this new testing procedure, and we receive very positive feedback.
