1.	The Equestrian world, including vaulting, could operate in 2022 almost under the same conditions as before the Covid19 pandemic and EHV-1.

2.	ACTIVITIES OF THE FEI VAULTING TECHNICAL COMMITTEE (VTC)	
	The focus of VTC was put <b>into the meetings with the community, explanation of the new rules changes</b> , updating the Guidelines, and preparing new wording for the Technical Test exercises.	
	VTC meets twice a month in online meetings, followed by much offline communication within VTC and with FEI.

	<b>New timeline of publishing the Guidelines</b> was introduced. In the past, Guidelines were published in December, short prior to the effective date (January 1s). VTC decided to change this cycle and worked hard to have Guidelines 2023 ready for posting right after the World Championship <b>in mid-August.</b> This new timeline allows the community to get familiar with the Guidelines enough
	ahead of the effective date.
	In <b>February through May</b> , VTC conducted <b>testing of the New Concept for Free test.</b> The testing was essential for deciding whether to incorporate the New Concept of Free test into the rules 2023.  The testing showed that there are still details that need to be worked out, therefor the implementation of this concept was postpoped. After the testing period <b>NTC</b>
	the implementation of this concept was postponed. After the testing period, VTC handed over the feedback to the Working group to implement given feedback. The Working group works on the proposal, which will reflect the feedback from the testing.
	<b>On March 19,</b> VTC organized an <b>Open Online Forum 2022</b> where the whole community could participate. More than 100 participants from 20 countries joined the Forum. Topics were dedicated to explaining the new rules, FEI updates, and new Technical Test exercises. VTC aims to organize such a Forum regularly.
	<b>From March to July,</b> VTC invested a lot of effort in preparing rules 2023 and Guidelines 2023; both documents were published in the planned timeline.
	During the whole of 2022, VTC members <b>actively participated in the projects of the FEI education department</b> , such as the Campus module for compulsories, updating all educational modules to the new rules/guidelines, and other cooperation.
	In <b>autumn 2022, three online sessions for judges</b> were held by VTC members with a focus on the new description of the compulsory exercises and reference scores. The vast majority of all FEI judges participated in all three sessions.
	At the end of October (21 – 23. October), the vaulting community met in person in Italy for the Annual FEI Vaulting Seminar after long two years. The Agenda was packed with many exciting vaulting topics, including information from the Education DPT of FEI, the Legal department of the FEI; session to brainstorm new ideas for the future of the sport was one of the highlights of the Seminar.
	<b>November and December 2022</b> is going to be dedicated to incorporating the community's feedback after the online sessions and seminar and making a final version of the Rules to be approved by FEI General Assembly in November and final Guidelines to be published by mid-December.
