A. PROPOSED RULES CHANGES TO BE VOTED AT THE FEI GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2022

Explanation for Proposed Change
The VTC had concluded that the proposed system needed further consideration before it could be implemented. This project had therefore been postponed to further review.
Proposed Wording on 6 July 2022
As of 1 January 2022, the FEI can, with the prior agreement of the relevant Organising Committee, test a new scoring system on a trial basis at selected events, it being understood and agreed that the new scoring system will not be used to calculate the official results.
The details/explanation of the new scoring system will be published on the Vaulting page of inside.fei.org. The FEI, in consultation with the FEI Vaulting Committee, can make revisions to the new scoring system from time to time provided that any changes must also be published on the Vaulting page.
If the FEI Vaulting Committee and the FEI decides that the trial of the new scoring system has been successful, it will be proposed for inclusion in the FEI Vaultinnog Rules 2023.

Correction of inconsistency – this was an oversight during the full rules revision and PDD should have been included in this article.

However, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the GRs, a Vaultler competing in a Junior Individual Championship competition or a Young Vaultlers Championship may compete in a Senior Squad <u>or Pas de Deux</u> Championship Competition in the same calendar year (this-these is-are the only exceptions to the rule).

The USEF supports these changes.
GER - In general we support the exceptions, but we would like to adjust it to the age of the vaultlers in question, to match the spirit of the rule better (It was implemented to make sure Senior Squads would still be able to compete for a country, even with a championship Junior Vaultler). A Junior Vaultler should only be allowed to compete in a Squad at Senior Championships as an exception. A Young Vaultler should only be allowed to compete EITHER in a Senior Squad OR in a Pas-de-Deux at Senior Championships as an exception.
<u>Proposed wording</u> of GER - However, and not withstanding anything to the contrary in the GRs, a Vaultler competing in a Junior Individual Championship competition may compete in a Senior Squad Championship competition, a Young Vaultler competing in a Young Vaultler Individual Championship may compete either in a Senior Squad or a Pas de Deux Championship Competition in the same calendar year (these are the only exceptions to the rule).

The VTC thanked the GER NF for their comments. The VTC reviewed the proposed wording and agreed to add the following sentence "Young Vaultlers competing in a Young Vaultler Individual " to avoid any misunderstanding". The VTC is of the opinion that the other changes do not affect the clarity of this article and that no further change would be relevant at this point in time.

Explanation for Proposed Change
For Horse Welfare reasons and to protect the image of the sport, the VTC suggests that the side reins may be unfastened straight after the Salute at the end of a test.
Proposed Wording on 6 July 2022
Immediately <u>after the salute, before</u> exiting the arena <u>competition circle</u> , the side reins must <u>may</u> be unfastened. <u>The Vaulters must run out first followed by the horse and lunger. At the latest, the reins must be unfastened immediately upon exiting the competition circle and Failure-failure</u> to do so will entail a Warning from the Steward.

The USEF supports these changes. GER - We only support the idea of unfastening the side reins immediately. But it is a contradiction to the intention of the rule, if the horse stays longer in the arena than the vaulters, that is longer than necessary (horse welfare!). Furthermore we should no longer make the horses go back to the centre of the competition circle in walk with side reins (that are being used for trot and canter) after the performance is done. Therefore we suggest that the side reins may be unfastened immediately when the lunger is back close to the horse and the salute iof the lunger is being done from there. Only the vaulters go back to the middle of the competition arena for the salute. We have tested this format during national selection competitions and would be willing to share video footage with the FEI Vaulting Committee. <u>Proposed wording</u> GER - For the final salute, the horse does not have to stand in the centre of the competition circle. After the last dismount, there should be a controlled and smooth transition finally to hold. After having collected the lunge, the lunger salutes in the direction of the judge at A from where the horse is standing. The side reins may be unfastened before or after the salute. After the salute, the horse and the lunger may directly leave the competition circle either in trot (if side reins are not unfastened) or in walk (if side reins are already unfastened). The final salute of the vaulters will be done from the centre of the competition circle at the same time with the lunger. Thus the horse and the lunger may leave the competition circle first while the vaulters may still run out on their final lap. At the latest, the side reins must be unfastened immediately upon exiting the competition circle and failure to do so will entail a Warning from the Steward. DEN - We strongly agree with the proposal, and we would like to suggest that it is not a choice to unfasten the side reins immediately after the salute but a requirement. A question: We presume that the horse and lunger will leave the circle at a walk, but this is not clear from the wording?

The VTC thanked the USEF for their support and the DEN NF and GER NF for their comments. The VTC would not be in favour not to have the final "Salute" with the horse, the lunger and the Vaulter(s) as this is the way their closed their performances. The VTC would like to keep it optional to go out the centre line with or without the side reins, by walk or by trot as imposing one or the other could cause safety issues depending of the horse. This article will be monitored closely in 2023.

Nosebands must be flat. Leather, sheepskin or similar material may be used on any part of the bridle providing the material does not exceed three centimetres in diameter measured from the Horse's skin.

DEN - We agree with a need for alignment between the Education system and the Rules. However, we would like to propose that instead of changing the Rules to align with the Education system, that the FEI consider changing the Education system requirements to align with the Rules.

It is permitted to have more than one PGJ at an Event, but this will likely cause confusion for both the OC, Chief Steward, and Ground Jury with regards to who makes the actual decisions. But with only one PGJ per CVI (19 CVI3* in 2022) of which many will likely choose a Level 4 as PGJ, the opportunities for Level 3 judges to obtain the requirements currently listed in the Education system will be limited even with the proposed rule change.

The VTC thanked the USEF for their support and the DEN NF for their comments.

The VTC thinks that if an OC wants to have two PGJ due to the size of their show it could be valuable to share the work between the two PGJ. This could serve the OC and new Judges officiating as PGJ for the first time. The VTC would like to emphasise that it is optional to have more than one PGJ and not mandatory. It would be under the responsibility of the OC to communicate properly with the Panel of Judges with regards to the responsibilities of each of them.

Explanation for Proposed Change
<p>NF Explanation:</p> <p>1. Urgent repairs, i.e., changes in the Rules that cannot await because of their impact on the welfare of the Horses or the safety of the Athletes.</p> <p>It appears that bleeding from one or two nostrils is not covered in current regulations. Nose blood can occur from bleeding in upper and/or lower airways (in racing horses not unusual with even lung bleeding, Exercise Induced Pulmonary Haemorrhage, EIPH, but usually after exercise).</p> <p>To distinguish from a suspected minor bleeding due to a small laceration of a nostril, the horse should be checked by an FEI Veterinarian after the performance.</p> <p>Nose blood should be a reason for elimination because of the impact on Horse welfare, but also for general perception, i.e., Social License to Operate (SLO).</p> <p>NF Proposal:</p> <p>2.6.2. If the FEI Steward discovers fresh blood in the Horse's mouth or nostril during the check at the end of the test (Article 719.4), they inform the Judge at A, who will eliminate the Competitive Unit.</p> <p>2.6.3. If the FEI Steward discovers fresh blood anywhere else on the Horse's body (i.e. other than the Horse's mouth or nostril) during the check at the end of the test, the Competitive Unit is not automatically eliminated. The FEI Chief Steward shall inform the Judge at A whether the Horse is fit to continue in following competition(s) in the Event. The Judge at A will take a decision on the Horse's fitness to continue, based on the FEI Veterinarian's advice. If the Judge at A decides the Horse is not fit to continue, the Horse will not be permitted to take part in any further Competition(s) or tests at the Event, but the result(s) obtained by the Competitive Unit in any Competition(s) or tests already completed shall stand.</p> <p>FEI Feedback:</p> <p>This proposal was discussed with the FEI Veterinary Department and the conclusion is that more in-depth research is needed before we can amend the current rule.</p>

C Comments received by 24 August 2022
<p>We have always had nominative and definitive registrations for the organisation of CVI competitions. In present, only nominative registrations have to be made for championships. This means that as an organiser you only know very late how many participants you are going to have. This is particularly difficult for the organising committee because you do not know in time whether you have to cancel or recruit judges. In the past we have had competitions with 200 solo voltigeurs and competitions with less than 100 solo voltigeurs and also sometimes up to 3 times more teams from one competition to another. If you have to rent horse stables and sometimes also place them. How many do you have to provide? Without nominative registrations you don't know if you have to place 100 or 200 stables. If you place too many stables, who can pay for all the empty stables? Certainly not in voltige where everything has to be done voluntarily and there is very little income. How will you be able to cough up the money if you have ordered 100 stalls too many? If this continues, it will discourage many organisers from starting. For the rest, I have no comments.</p>

The VTC would like to inform the BEL NF that as Vaulting is not yet in the FEI Entry System they can still add nominated entries dates in their FEI Schedule. The nominated entries dates would be further discussed internally within the FEI in 2023 to see what would suit best the Organisers across all disciplines which have the FEI Entry system.</p>
