




History and Context -Background

- January 2016-EA Eventing Committee RMWG formed
- March/April 2016 Two Eventing Fatalities
- June 2016 EA Eventing Committee initiates 5 short term actions on the advice of the RMWG
- □ Review of MER for NC & D Athletes
- Implement Riders Rep System for National Star Classes
- Reinforce need for consistent athlete sanction process
- □ Guideline to Implement Frangible Devices Widely
- Conduct a CD Workshop
- Nov/Dec 2016 –EA Review Reports for Scone/Sydney



Tattersalls Workshop –A Key Takeaway





- January –Terry Snow "Equestrian Australia Making Eventing Safer Fund" and Olivia Inglis Foundation Generously offer Funding Support
- April –funded NSO appointment
- May "Making Eventing Safer Fund" supports acceleration of frangible device implementation
- May— Standard National TD report adopted and information gathering process and personnel.
- June Australian (EA105 & below) XC Guidelines
- October -EA Eventing Committee approve trial of Equiratings funded by "Making Eventing Safer Fund"
- November EA Eventing Committee makes use of frangible devices compulsory(*classes) from Feb 1 2018 and commits to "front shoulder" guideline
