THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

The FEI will NOT insure:

All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

Athletes whose Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other passport requirements including for vaccination and Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030) will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this, failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

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Exceptions to the requirement for FEI equine influenza vaccinations currently exist only for those Horses competing at CNs or CIMs where there are no national requirements for influenza vaccination in both the Event host country and the Horse's country of origin (General Regulations Article 137).

EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1032

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport, their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

HORSE INSPECTIONS 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1033

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit not to compete will be eliminated by the Ground Jury and not be permitted to continue in the competition.

LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

Horses are not eligible to compete when a limb, or part of a limb, is hyposensitive or hypersensitive (both of which shall constitute "abnormal limb sensitivity"). Hypersensitive limbs have an excessive or abnormal reaction to palpation. Hyposensitive limbs include any alteration in sensitivity induced by a neurectomy or chemical desensitisation for as long as the alteration in sensitivity persists.

All Horses are subject to Examination under the Protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the Period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for Examination under the Protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

6. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION 2014 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

Within FEI Groups I & II, the Organising Committee should charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is affected by the FEI Veterinary Department.

SAMPLING

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1057 and 1058).

CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications (the EPSL) is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: www.FEICleanSport.org as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

Elective Testing may be carried out, by Competitors for their Horses, prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances (please refer to www.FEI.org/veterinary for information and details **Art. 1956**)

7. PONIES

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement prior to the Horse Inspection and throughout the event be subject to the requirements of the 2014 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IV).

8. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; such information is essential to ensure that (i) the Horse's welfare remains paramount at all times and (ii) sound scientific reasoning is applied to the safety of all Horses and Athletes participating at Events.

XI. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

At a minimum, and pursuant to the ADRHAs, Organisers must provide the following at Events where human anti-doping testing is scheduled to take place at least 2 months prior to the Event:

1. One (1) staff member able to act as point of contact and coordinator for the *Doping Control Officers (DCOs)* with the contact name and details of this staff member to be communicated to the *FEI* at least two (2) weeks prior to the starting date of the *Event*.
2. Human anti-doping facilities reasonably separated from public activity, consisting of:
 - one (1) private room exclusively dedicated for use by the *DCOs* with one (1) table, two (2) chairs, pens and paper and one (1) lockable fridge; and
 - a waiting room/area with a suitable number of chairs as well as an appropriate amount of individually sealed, non-caffeinated and non alcoholic beverages, which includes a mix of natural mineral water and soft drinks ; and
 - one (1) private and clean bathroom/toilet, adjacent or as near as possible to the *DCO* room and waiting area.
3. Staff members (or volunteers) of both genders, able to act as *Chaperones*. The number of *Chaperones* available to the *OC* must be communicated to the *FEI* as early as possible following receipt by the *OC* of the *Testing* plan for the *Event*.

Please see the qualifications for Chaperones in the ADRHAs.

XII. SPECIFIC RULES FOR THE "FEI WORLD JUMPING CHALLENGE FINAL"

1. FALLS

The first fall of a rider or a rider and horse eliminates the rider and the horse from the competition. However, they can take part in the Farewell Competition

2. HORSES

The competitions will be on borrowed horses provided by the OC. Horses must be six years old or over.

3. DRAW OF BORROWED HORSES

Each Athlete will draw a horse with which he/she will ride throughout the competition. An athlete may not ride his/her own horse.

4. SUBSTITUTION OF HORSES

A draw will be carried out right after the vet check for all participants to determine which horse they will ride throughout the entire competition.

The OC must provide at least 5 horses in the case of injury, illness or incompatibility with the rider. Injury and illness must be verified by the FEI Veterinary Delegate. Horses may only be substituted in agreement with the Ground Jury. In the case of a substitution of a horse, between the end of the 1st Qualifier and the start of the Final with Rotation of Athletes' competition, points may not be carried forward and the competitor in question may take part only in the Farewell competition. Horses cannot be substituted for the Final with Rotation of Athletes' competition

5. DRAW FOR THE STARTING ORDER

The names of all the riders and the country they represent will be arranged alphabetically. Each rider, in this alphabetical order will draw a start number. The President of the Ground Jury must be present.

6. STEWARDING

All training sessions and preparation for competitions will be stewarded.

A list of 3 options must be given by the owner of the lent horse to the OC in case of a substitution of the bits

7. TRAINING SESSIONS

Not more than six obstacles may be jumped in total during any training session. Cross poles are not included in this amount. Three attempts at jumping an obstacle count as one obstacle jumped. One double or one triple counts as one obstacle.

Horses may be ridden once daily for not more than 30 minutes. In agreement with the rider, the horse's trainer or any other person, proving he has received the owners' authorisation, may school the horse during the training period. If the trainer jumps the horse, the number of times jumped will be deducted from the number of times permitted for the rider to jump his horse during the training period. Horses must be ridden with the bit in which they are usually worked and presented at the time of the draw. The bit may be changed only with the agreement of the owner.

8. DRESS

In accordance with the rules for International Jumping Events, Dress Art. 256.1:

256.1.1. Athletes are required to wear correct dress when appearing before spectators and are required to dress in accordance with paragraph JRs Art. 256.1.5 and 1.6 Art. 256.3.1.2.1(e) when they are competing or during the presentation of prizes.

256.1.2. When inspecting the course, dress must be neat and tidy. In any case, riding boots, white or light fawn breeches, a long- or short-sleeved shirt and a white tie or choker must be worn. Shirts must have a white collar; long-sleeved shirts must have white cuffs.

The FEI World Jumping Challenge Final is open to competitors from the year in which they reach the age of 15.

312.7. Accidents, Elimination or Retirement

312.7.1. If one of the four Athletes or Horses qualified is unable to participate for reasons of health, he will automatically be replaced by the Athlete placed 5th and so on. (In the event of equality for 5th place the procedure laid down in paragraph 1 of the present Article 312 will be followed).

312.7.2. The Athlete on the 5th place must keep himself and his Horse ready until a time to be determined by the Ground Jury in case he has to replace one of the four Athlete/Horse qualified.

312.7.3 If an Athlete has an accident during the Final preventing him from continuing, but the Horse with which he has the accident is able to continue, the Horse must compete in all the rounds with the other finalists.

312.7.4. If an Athlete is eliminated or retires and does not complete one of his rounds for any reason, he will be awarded the same number of Penalties as that incurred by the Athlete who has been the most severely penalised during the same round, plus 20 Penalties. If the Athlete eliminated or who has retired had himself received the highest number of Penalties before being eliminated or retiring, 20 Penalties will be added to his score for that round.

312.7.5. If a Horse is not fit to participate in the second, third or fourth round, the results it has obtained so far, except its result in the first round, are cancelled. The Athlete of the Horse that is unable to continue will not participate in the fourth round. In this case the total result of each Athlete is determined over three rounds, one on his own Horse and two on other Horses.
