#### 3. Type of Allocation of Quota Places:

The quota place is allocated to the NOC.

### C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to, Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors). Only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Olympic Games.

#### Age Requirements:

All athletes participating in the Rio 2016 Olympic Games must be born on or before 31 December 2000 (16 years of age).

All horses participating in the Rio 2016 Olympic Games must be born on or before 31 December 2008 (eight years of age).



## QUALIFICATION SYSTEM – GAMES OF THE XXXI OLYMPIAD – RIO 2016

### Additional IF Requirements:

To be eligible to participate in the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, all athletes/horses must achieve the following minimum eligibility requirement as a combination:

A minimum 64% must be attributed twice to the athlete/horse combination by both a 5\* star judge and as an average from all judges in the competition, and the score must be achieved in a Grand Prix test at two different CDI3\*/CDI4\*/CDI5\*/CDI-W/CDIO events. The two 5\* judges must be of a nationality other than of the athlete. Scores achieved in Preliminary or Consolation Grand Prix classes judged by three Judges do not count towards the minimum eligibility requirement.

Athletes and horses must obtain the minimum eligibility requirement at events which take place from 1 January 2015 until 19 June 2016 included.

The list of approved selected events for achieving qualification / the minimum eligibility requirements will be published on the FEI website: [www.fei.org](http://www.fei.org) . The list of 2015 events will be published in December 2014 and the 2016 events will be published in December 2015.

### D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

FEI Olympic Groups as referred to through the qualification procedure are based on the following seven (7) geographical regions:

- A - North Western Europe;
- B - South Western Europe;
- C - Central & Eastern Europe; Central Asia
- D - North America;
- E - Central & South America;
- F - Africa & Middle East;
- G - South East Asia, Oceania

### QUALIFICATION PLACES

The qualification events are listed in hierarchical order of qualification.

#### Team Qualification

10 NOCs will obtain "direct" qualification; nine (9) team quota places will be allocated through team championships or a special qualification event and one (1) as a Host Country place, as per the table below. A team consists of minimum three (3) athletes/horses and maximum of four (4) athletes/horses.

### Individual Qualification

Only NOCs which have not obtained “direct” team qualification are eligible to qualify for individual quota places. Each athlete can qualify a maximum of one (1) quota place for his/her NOC.

### HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Host Country is guaranteed one (1) team with a maximum of four (4) athletes. Each athlete and horse must obtain the minimum eligibility requirements to compete as listed in paragraph **C. Athlete Eligibility**. In case the Host Country is unable to field a team, it may send one (1) or two (2) eligible individual athletes instead.

### E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

Following each qualification event, the FEI will publish the results on its website (<https://data.fei.org/Calendar/Search.aspx>). After 6 March 2016, the FEI will inform the respective NOCs/NFs in writing of their allocated quota places. The NOCs will have to confirm by 31 March 2016 if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

### F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

#### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

##### Unused team quota places (excluding Host Country places)

If the members of a qualified team do not reach the minimum eligibility requirements or if a team quota place is declined by an NOC, the team quota place will be reallocated as individual quota places as follows:

1. The NOC in question may then compete with a maximum of two (2) athletes in the individual competition.
2. Any remaining unused quota place(s) will go to the NOC of the next best ranked athlete on the FEI Olympic Athletes Ranking – Dressage (allocation through overall ranking).

Should an NOC send three (3) athletes as part of their team instead of the maximum four (4) entitled, the unused athlete quota place will be reallocated to the NOC of the next best ranked athlete from the FEI Olympic Athletes Ranking – Dressage (allocation through overall ranking).

##### Unused individual quota places

If an allocated individual quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated as follows:

- If a quota place was obtained through the Individual Championships or the FEI special qualification event, it will be reallocated to the NOC of the next best ranked athlete in the respective event. If none of the NOCs with athletes ranked in the respective qualification events are able to use the quota place, it will be reallocated to the next best ranked athlete on the FEI Olympic Athletes Ranking – Dressage (allocation through overall ranking).

- If the quota place was obtained through the FEI Olympic Athletes Ranking – Dressage (allocation through FEI Olympic Groups) it will be reallocated to the NOC of the next best ranked athlete from that group. Only if none of the NOCs with athletes ranked in the respective group are able to use the quota place, it will be reallocated to the next best ranked athlete on the FEI Olympic Athletes Ranking – Dressage (allocation through overall ranking).
- If the quota place was obtained through the FEI Olympic Athletes Ranking – Dressage (allocation through overall ranking) it will be reallocated to the NOC of the next best ranked athlete on the said ranking.

### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

In case the Host Country is unable to field a team, the team quota place will be reallocated to the highest ranked team on the Team Ranking of the 2015 Pan-American Games not already qualified.

If the Host Country then decides to send one (1) or two (2) eligible athletes instead of a team, the total number of athletes that can qualify through the FEI Olympic Ranking List - Dressage (allocation through overall ranking) will be reduced by the number of individual athletes sent by the Host Country, one (1) or two (2).

## G. GENERAL PRINCIPLES REGARDING THE USE OF P ALTERNATE ATHLETES

### P ALTERNATE ATHLETES

P alternate athletes are non-competing athletes, and are not included within the athlete's quota as described in Paragraph **B. Athletes Quota**. More detailed information about entitlements and quotas can be found in the 'Accreditation at the Olympic Games – Users Guide'. P alternate athletes can only become competing athletes as per the conditions outlined in the 'IOC/Rio 2016 Late Athlete Replacement policy'.

#### Eligibility:

P alternate athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in above paragraph **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

#### Quota:

Each team which has obtained direct qualification is entitled to one (1) P alternate athlete and one (1) P alternate horse for a total of 10 P alternate athletes and 10 P alternate horses for Dressage.
