Dear Endurance Stakeholders,

As you will recall, further to the approval of the new FEI Endurance Rules, the 2019 FEI General Assembly voted to give a mandate to the FEI Board to decide:

- which provisions will take effect on 1 January 2020; (i)
- which provisions will be implemented on 1 July 2020; and (ii)
- the final wording of the transitional provisions. (iii)

A detailed review was carried out by FEI Headquarters to identify what rules can be implemented on 1 January 2020 and which rules will only apply as of 1 July 2020 and, if a new rule cannot be implemented on 1 January 2020 what existing rule (if any) should apply instead.

Further to this review, the FEI Board has decided that all provisions of the FEI **Endurance Rules 2020**, with the **exception** of those provisions identified in the **table** on pages 2 – 4 below, will be implemented on 1 January 2020.

Where a provision cannot be implemented on 1 January 2020, it will automatically come into force on 1 July 2020. The table also identifies what rule will apply instead during the period 1 January – 30 June 2020.

For ease of reference, we have published a "Transitional Rulebook" (also referred to as the "January Rules") that will apply during the period 1 January – 30 June 2020 so that the Endurance community will be able to refer to one document for all the rules that will apply during that period. The Transitional Rulebook is a mixture of those new rules that can be implemented as of 1 January 2020 and the old (2019) rules that will need to apply until the rest of the new rules come into force on 1 July 2020.

We have also published the following documents:

- A mark-up version of the Transitional Rulebook, where the provisions of the new rules that will not apply until 1 July and their replacement provisions during the period 1 January – 30 June 2020 have been highlighted in yellow.
- The **Full Rulebook** that will apply as of 1 July 2020 (i.e. the new rules approved by the FEI General Assembly), now with the updated transitional provisions included.
- A mark-up version of the Full Rulebook that will apply as of 1 July 2020, showing the changes (e.g. transitional provisions) from the version published directly after the 2019 FEI General Assembly.

IT development work will not be completed by 1 January 2020	Article 864 of the 2020 FEI Endurance Rules will apply but the references to penalty points for trainers (in Article 864 and any other articles) will be deleted until 1 July 2020.
<i>a)</i> Annex 3: <i>Elimination Codes</i>	 a) Some elimination codes are linked to rule changes that do not come into force until 1 July 2020 	 a) Elimination codes: Annex 3 of the new rule book will apply but those elimination codes that are not applicable until 1 July 2020 will be deleted.
b) Annex 7: Examination After Third (or Subsequent) FTQ- GA	 b) Corresponding article (MOOCP) does not apply until 1 July 2020. 	 b) During the Transition Period, the 2019 rest period rules will apply instead of the new MOOCP rules and under the 2019 rest period rules, this examination is only mandatory after the <u>fourth</u> consecutive FTQ-GA (rather than the third (or subsequent) as will be the case as of 1 July 2020). subsequent) FTQ-GA" will be changed to "after fourth consecutive FTQ-GA" in the Transitional Rulebook.
