TOKYO 2020 OLYMPIC GAMES

The lists of Events that count to achieve the minimum eligibility requirements (Certificate of Capability) in 2020 for Jumping, Dressage and Eventing have been published on **Inside.FEI.org**. No additions of Events will be accepted after the publication of the selected Events calendar. Replacement in case of cancellation of an Event for force majeure reasons will be reviewed on a case to case basis.

Please also note that the final Olympic Rankings for Jumping, Dressage and Eventing have been published on 6 January, 2020 on the **FEI website**.

FEI EVENTING RULES – MEMO – APPLICATION OF 2020 EVENTING SANCTION SYSTEM

Following the approval of the 2020 FEI Eventing rule proposals by the 2019 FEI General Assembly, the updated Eventing sanction system, which was updated to line-up the sanctions arising from Yellow Warning Cards in Eventing with the other FEI disciplines, will be implemented as of 1 January 2020.

The implementation of the sanction system as described in the 2020 FEI Eventing rules will require a transition period. A memo on the application of the 2020 Eventing sanction system is now available [here](#), together with the 2020 FEI Eventing rules.

Kindly also note that recently articles 523.3 and 524.3.2 have been slightly corrected to line up with the updated sanction system:

- Athletes not seeing a doctor after a fall will receive an Eventing Recorded Warning Card
- An Athlete leaving the venue after not having completed the Cross Country Test and without having his Horse checked by the Veterinary Delegate will receive an Eventing Recorded Warning Card

The updated Yellow Warning Cards and Eventing Recorded Warning Cards will be available on [Inside.FEI.org](#) in January 2020.

Following the 2019 FEI Vaulting seminars and based on the comments of the participants, the FEI Vaulting Technical Committee have made some amendments to the 2020 FEI Vaulting Guidelines.

The 2020 FEI Vaulting Guidelines are available on the [Inside.FEI.org](#), effective from 1 January 2020.

The 2020 Guidelines include the new proposal presented by the Horse Score working group and approved by the FEI Vaulting Technical Committee. FEI EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

Following consultation with the European Equestrian Federation, the bid timetable for the **FEI European Championships 2023** in the disciplines FEI Jumping, Dressage, Para Dressage, Eventing, Vaulting and Driving has been modified to allow more time for interested parties to submit their bids.

Interested parties now have until **2 October 2020** to, through their National Federation, submit a Bid Application Form to the FEI via the [FEI Online Bidding Platform](#). The applicable Bid Process Timeline is as follows:

Phase I Applicant Phase

2 October 2020

Deadline for Applicants to submit a Bid and all supporting documentation

Phase II Candidate Phase

1 November 2020

Draft Host Agreement to be provided to Candidates

22 January 2021

Host Agreement to be signed by Candidate and National Federation and returned to the FEI

February - March 2021

FEI Internal evaluation of Bids and possible Bid presentations at FEI Headquarters

Phase III Decision and Allocation Phase

April 2021 or June 2021
FEI Board Meeting (TBD)

Allocation decision by FEI Board upon
recommendation of the Technical
Committee of each Discipline and
announcement of the host organisers of the
FEI European Championships 2023
