

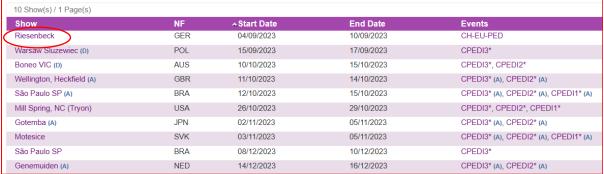
Guidelines for FEI Level 1 Classifiers

The information provided below will assist you to navigate your way through the requirements for a Level 1 Classifier (trainee). These guidelines should be read in conjunction with the FEI Education System for Para Dressage Officials and FEI General Regulations.

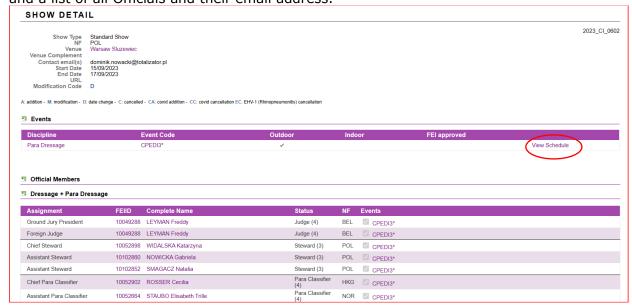
According to the Education System, to become Level 2 FEI Classifier, Level 1 Classifier must: \Box Complete four (4) Athlete Evaluations with a positive recommendation from a Level 3 (or higher) Para Equestrian Classifier at a minimum of two (2) CPEDIs in the last three years

How to organise attending a competition as a Level 1 Classifier

- Level 1 Classifiers can complete their requirements at any level CPEDI competition
- Consult the <u>FEI Calendar</u> for a list of upcoming competitions. Search by "Para Dressage" in discipline field
- Identify a date and location that you are able to attend
- Click on the Show name and further detail will appear



• Then click on *view schedule* for more information with contact details for the Organiser (OC) and a list of all Officials and their email address.



- If the Schedule is not yet available, contact the FEI Para Dressage department
- Email the Chief Classifier once known and well in advance of the competition to request your attendance as a Level 1 Classifier. Approval to attend may depend on if other Level 1 Classifiers are attending and the number of athletes to be classified.
- Once the Chief Classifier has approved, then email the OC to request attendance as a Level 1 Classifier.



- Ensure you request contact details such as mobile phone number, What's App contact, etc before you arrive.
- All travel and accommodation expenses associated with attending should be cover by the Level 1 Classifier. It will be up to the OC as to whether meals will be paid for whilst attending, so this should be clarified prior to attending. The OC is not required to meet these costs.
- The FEI Head of Classification (HoC) should be informed by email by the Chief Classifier that a Level 1 Classifier is attending a competition.
- Attendance by a Level 1 Classifier should be recorded in the Classifier Report.

During the competition

- Confirm details with the Chief Classifier as to when you should arrive and arrange meeting details and location of the classification room, etc.
- Dress is practical for carrying out a physical assessment, be neat and tidy with closed in shoes. No clothing with national logos should be worn as FEI Officials
- Level 1 Classifiers should stay at competition the same length of time as the other FEI Classifiers.
- A Level 1 Classifier:
 - o is not an official member of the Classification Panel and cannot allocate an FEI Grade.
 - o may be appointed to participate in some or all components of an Athlete evaluation.
 - must not fulfil any other role at the competition.
 - o must declare any Conflict of Interest to the Chief Classifier, for example, being related to a competitor at the competition.

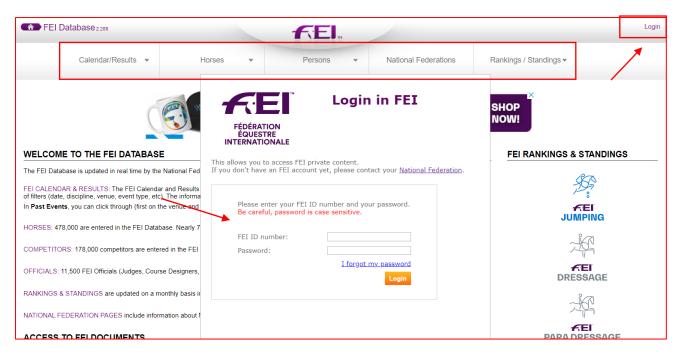
During the athlete evaluation process

- The Chief Classifier will notify the Level 1 Classifier prior to the competition of athletes to be classified and the schedule for classifications
- The Level 1 Classifier should read the athlete information on the <u>FEI Database</u> prior to attending the evaluation session. Login details should have been provided by the FEI previously. If not, please contact the <u>FEI Para Dressage Department</u>
- The Chief Classifier will determine the involvement of the Level 1 Classifier in each athlete evaluation, including the Observation Assessment. This may depend on the context of the evaluation at the time, such as complexity of the presenting health condition of the athlete.
- The Level 1 Classifier will comply with the reasonable requests made by the Classification Panel in respect of the duties of the classification panel
- If the Level 1 Classifier is approached by other Officials, they should refer any questions to the Classification Panel regarding the athletes
- As time for each athlete evaluation can be limited, especially if a number of athletes are to be classified, it may not be possible to have lengthy discussion until the evaluation is completed
- The Level 1 Classifier should be always respectful to the athlete and ensure the confidentiality of their personal information.

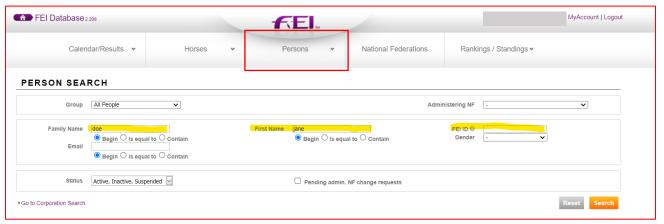
How to login and use the FEI Database

• Go to https://data.fei.org/Default.aspx and login with your FEI ID and password

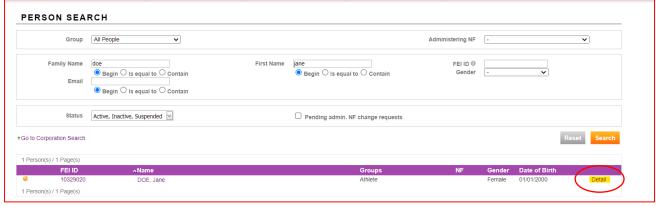




- Once you are logged in (you can see your name at the top right), you have access to different parts of the FEI database (FEI Course Calendar, Horses, Persons, National Federation, etc)
- To find information on an athlete, click on *Persons*. Then, you can search a specific athlete by name or with their FEI ID

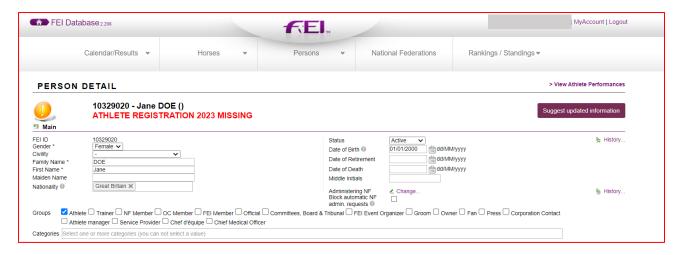


Once you have found the athlete, you can click on *Details* to have access to the athlete's profile

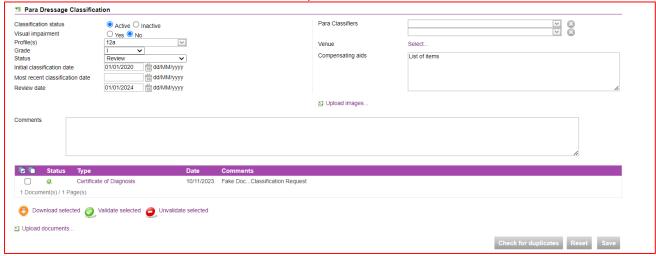


When you are on the athlete's profile, you can see their general information at the top
