

INFORMATION FOR SIT-IN

Please note that this document should be read in conjunction with the <u>Education System</u> <u>for Vaulting Officials</u>.

1. In General

- Sit-Ins can be done at any CVIs (except Masterclass, Championship and World Cup Final).
- The candidate must be assessed by a Level 3 or Level 4 judge.
- The candidate must sit in with the judge throughout the whole competition (to include all tests).

2. Task of the Candidate

- The candidate must confirm that a Level 3 or Level 4 judge is judging at the event. If this is the case, the candidate contacts the OC at least 4 weeks before an event and inform them about their wish to sit-in. If the OC agrees, the candidate will contact the judge.
- It is the responsibility of the candidate to contact the OC again shortly before the event and ask for all details concerning their Sit-In (timetable etc...).

3. Task of the Judge

The judge must evaluate the candidate according to the Assessment Form.

- 1. The judge evaluates the appearance of the candidate: e.g. friendly, openminded, well behaved, appropriately dressed, well on time, well prepared with good knowledge of the test and also check the knowledge of their spoken English.
- 2. The candidate must be asked some questions about vaulting / judging principles in the break between two horses and during the test whenever possible. Corrections should be given by the judge directly if needed.
- The candidate must be given the opportunity to propose marks in the course of the test whenever there is time. This way their <u>knowledge</u>, <u>decisiveness</u> and the <u>tempo</u> in which they are able to give the requested marks can be tested. Corrections should be given by the judge directly if needed.
- 4. The correct usage of the technical language will be checked through the candidate's remarks.

After the class, the judge informs the candidate about the outcome of the Sit-In, emphasises their strengths and gives further recommendations on areas of improvement.

The Sit-In Assessment Form should be sent to the FEI Vaulting department (<u>thya.moritz@fei.org</u>) by the judge within two weeks after the event.
