Quota places for both Teams and Individuals are allocated to the NOC.

### **C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY**

#### **C.1. Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules**

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of the FEI, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

#### **C.2 Age requirements**

To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024, athletes must be born on or before 31 December 2006 (no younger than 18 years of age in the year that the Olympic Games take place).

All horses participating in the Olympic Games Paris 2024 must be born on or before 31 December 2015 (no younger than nine years of age in the year that the Olympic Games take place).

#### **C.3. Additional IF eligibility criteria**

Athletes must also comply with the Minimum Eligibility Requirements criteria.

The applicable Minimum Eligibility Requirements will be published following approval at the FEI General Assembly on 13 November 2022 (and subsequent confirmation by the IOC).

### **D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY**

#### **D.1. QUOTA PLACES**

##### **Men/Women**

##### **Team Qualification**

20 NOCs will obtain team qualification; one (1) as a host country place, 17 team quota places will be allocated through FEI Olympic Group Qualification Events and two (2) through the FEI Jumping Nations Cup™ Finals 2022 and 2023, as per the table below.

A team consists of three (3) Athlete/Horse combinations.

**Individual Qualification:**

Only NOCs that have not accepted a team quota place are eligible to obtain individual quota places.

Each athlete can obtain a maximum of one (1) individual quota place for that athlete's NOC.

For Jumping, a nation can qualify for a maximum of one (1) individual place.

**The FEI Olympic Ranking – Jumping**

The FEI Olympic Ranking – Jumping (as defined in the Appendix) is limited to the best **15 results** per Athlete/Horse **combination** in the Olympic Ranking Events within the period from **1 January 2023 – 31 December 2023**.

Reallocation of unused qualification places is part of the consultation process the FEI has begun with its stakeholders and will finalised/approved at the FEI General Assembly in November 2022 and then submitted to the IOC for final approval.



## D.2. HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will be allocated one (1) team quota place with a maximum of three (3) Athletes. Each Athlete and Horse must fulfil the minimum age requirements and the minimum eligibility requirements to compete. In case the host country is unable to field a team, it may send one eligible (1) individual athlete instead.

## E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

### E.1. CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

Following each qualification event, the FEI will publish the results on its website (<https://inside.fei.org>).

The Team and Individual quota places will be confirmed separately as detailed in paragraph **G. Qualification Timeline**.

By January 2024 (Date TBC), further to receipt of the NOC Certificate of Capability from the relevant NOCs, the FEI will inform the respective NOCs/NFs in writing of their allocated team quota places. Each NOC must confirm or decline the allocated team quota place by February 2024 (Date TBC).

After the NOCs' confirmation of team participation, the FEI will inform the respective NOCs/NFs in writing of their allocated individual quota places and each NOC with Individuals must confirm the use of quota places, as detailed in paragraph **G. Qualification Timeline**.

### E.2. CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country must confirm in writing to the FEI by January 2024 (Date TBC) the use of its host country places.

### F.2. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

In case the Host Country is unable to field a team or decides to send one (1) eligible Athlete instead of a team, the unused Athletes quota places will be reallocated to the NOCs of the highest ranked Athletes, not already qualified, on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking–Jumping.

### F.3 AP ATHLETES

Definition:



Ap athletes are non-competing athletes accredited in the “Ap” category who have different entitlements to competing athletes (accredited as “Aa”) as described in the “Ap” accreditation quotas and conditions outlined in the IOC Accreditation Guide. These alternate athletes are not part of the athlete quota as described in Paragraph **B. Quota Places**. “Ap” alternate athletes could become competing athletes only under the conditions outlined in the IOC/Paris 2024 Late Athlete Replacement policy.

Only NOCs that have qualified a team are entitled to Ap athlete (one athlete and one reserve horse per team) as described in the qualification system.

Eligibility:

“Ap” athletes and Reserve Horses must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in paragraph **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

## APPENDIX – Definitions

**Composite Team:** A three (3) member team from an NOC. The Composite Team will be selected according to the following process:

- the respective rankings of each NOC's top three (3) different athletes in the FEI Olympic Ranking – Jumping shall be added together to give an aggregate ranking;
- the NOC with the best aggregate ranking shall be awarded the redistributed quota place;
- in the event of a tie (i.e., where the aggregate rankings are the same), the redistributed quota place shall be awarded to the NOC with the highest ranked athlete on the FEI Olympic Ranking - Jumping. In the event of a further tie, the redistributed quota place shall be awarded to the NOC with the second highest ranked athlete on the FEI Olympic Ranking - Jumping, and so on. If the tie cannot be broken following this process, the FEI will invite the NOCs/NFs concerned to a draw.

**FEI Certificate of Capability:** A certificate that must be provided by the National Federation to the FEI for each Athlete and Horse that are nominated to participate in the Olympic Games. This certificate confirms the minimum eligibility requirements as laid down in the FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events at the Olympic Games. It confirms that the Athletes and the Horses have the necessary experience and ability to participate at the required standard.

**FEI Olympic Ranking – Jumping:** The official rankings based on results achieved by an Athlete and Horse as a combination at the Olympic Ranking Events during the period 01 January 2023 – 31 December 2023. The List of the Olympic Ranking Events and the relevant ranking rules will be published by December 2022 (exact date TBC).

**FEI Olympic Group Qualification Events:** Those events at which teams from specific FEI Olympic Groups can participate in order to earn a team quota place, namely:

- For FEI Olympic Groups A and B: the 2023 FEI Jumping European Championships;
- For FEI Olympic Group C: the 2023 Group C FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event;
- For FEI Olympic Groups D and E: the 2023 Pan-American Games;
- For FEI Olympic Group F: the 2023 Group F FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event;
- For FEI Olympic Group G: the 2023 Group G FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event.

**MER Deadline:** TBC

**MER Events:** Those events at which Athletes and Horses can earn the minimum eligibility requirements.

**NOC Certificate of Capability:** NOC confirmation that at least three (3) Athlete/Horse combinations from that NOC have achieved the minimum eligibility requirements during the period FEI Jumping World Championships 2022– 31 December 2023. Such confirmation must be provided to the FEI by 5 January 2024.

**Olympic Ranking Events:** Those events at which points for the FEI Olympic Rankings – Jumping can be earned.
