The FEI Veterinary Department would like to update you with some information relevant to your role:

Publication of new detection times

We are pleased to announce the publication of detection times for five substances – butorphanol, romifidene, firocoxib, salbutamol and cetirizine. We hope this information will assist treating veterinarians who treat sports horses to calculating safe withdrawal times. The new FEI List of Detection Times can be accessed [here](#).

Use of nebulisers during FEI events

The use of nebulisers at FEI events is considered a non-oral therapy and their use must therefore be in compliance with Article 1062 of the Veterinary Regulations. A Veterinary Form B must be submitted for any substance used in a nebuliser that is not listed on the FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List.
