## **Chapter 2 – Structure of Competitions**

#### 2024:

Art. 503.4 Age of Horses

d) CCI5\*level Competitions and Four star Level Championships: a Horse may compete in Competitions of five star level or four star Championship from the beginning of the calendar year in which the Horse reaches the age of eight nine.

## **Chapter 4 – Officials**

2024: Art. 513.10 Conflict of Interest

(...)

The FEI will review requests (on a case by case basis) from Officials to act as a Course Designer at a lower level Event (i.e. below 4\* level) in a situation where they might otherwise have an actual or perceived conflict of interest (as described in the FEI Officials' Code of Conduct) and where the conflict is unavoidable provided that the Course Designer declares the conflict and makes the request in writing to the FEI Eventing Department in good time (and no later than 4 weeks prior to the Event).

## **Chapter 4 – Officials**

2024: NEW

515.4.3 Reporting to the FEI

The Course Designer is responsible for providing the Cross-Country related reports to FEI Headquarters within 10 days following the end of the Event.

# Chapter 5 – Technical Requirements for Participation

#### 2024:

Art. 518.3 CCI4\*-S/L and CCI5\*-L additional requirements

Horses having not completed the Cross Country test of at an FEI Competition for a period\* of 13 consecutive months or more will have to complete an event at a lower level before entering a CCI4\*-S/L or CCI5\*-L event as follows:

- Horses having obtained a MER at CCI4\*-S or CCI3\*-S/L:
  - to enter a CCI4\*-S: must complete the Cross Country test of a CCI3\*-S/L
- Horses having obtained a MER at CCI4\*-L:
  - to enter a CCI4\*-L or CCI5\*-L: must complete the Cross Country test of a CCI4\*-S
- Horses having obtained a MER at CCI5\*-L:
  - to enter a CCI5\*-L: must complete the Cross Country test of a CCI4\*-S/L

<sup>\*</sup>Period calculated from the date of the cross-country test of the first event to the date of the cross-country test of the following event.

2024: NEW

549.4.1 Representing a frangible fence after a Disobedience

Reattempting an activated frangible fence element not correctly restored to its original condition will result in elimination.

## **Chapter 10 – Jumping Test**

The jumping cups must have a depth of minimum 20 mm and maximum 25 mm. This also applies for safety cups.

### Other...

Recommendation - Automatic discussions with Athletes involved in a Horse fall.

Following any Horse Fall on Cross Country, a systematic interview/discussion will need to be place between the Athlete and the Ground Jury (President or Member) and/or the Technical Delegate. The aim is educational to understand the circumstances to learn for the future – Horse falls are a serious risk factor for athlete, horse and our sport and need to be minimised. The discussion is to be recorded in the Judge and/or TD report (a section will be added in the reports).
