Summary:

➤ 2001: The “breakable Pole” is used in the Netherlands



- 2016: Experience with the MIM-system on national eventing competitions
- 2024: MIM-system compulsory on national competitions



MIM-system:

- It took some time to gain experience using the MIM properly on the national competitions
- We wanted to be sure that the MIM was future-proof
- We wanted to make sure that there was further development



MIM devices in the national sport:



- Compulsory 1.00m/1.10m class (higher than 1.10m is always FEI)
- The use of MIM devices is an important topic in the (refresher) courses
- Only MIM devices approved by FEI
- For national competitions free of charge available.



The Dutch Pole:

- No new production
- The stock is available to the national organizers
- In about 5 years the last poles will be worn out



Funding safety devices:

- The costs of MIM-devices are paid by the “Eventing Safety Fund”
- Riders pay € 2.50 to the “Eventing Safety Fund” per start

MIM is “cheaper” (no logistic operation is required)

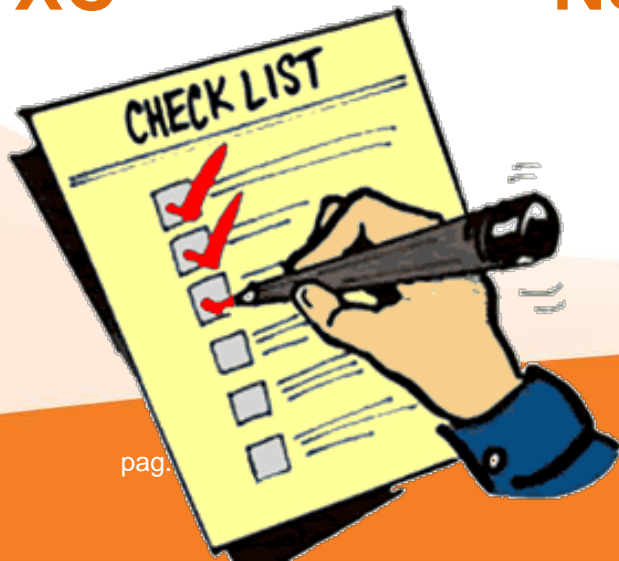


Rule changes 2020

Promotion points (MER):

Dressage
Jumping
XC

max score 45 Penalty Points
max score 12 Penalty Points
No Penalty Points



Rule changes 2020:

NOT ALLOWED IN XC WHEN:

Dressage score > 55 Penalty points
or

Show Jumping score ≥ 20 Penalty Points
