1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Welcome to Santiago 2023

The Pan American and Parapan American Games are a sport party, with a world class organization that allows the athletes from the Americas to reach excellence. The celebration will unfold the natural beauty, dynamism, and multicultural energy of Santiago de Chile.

1.2 Santiago as a city

Santiago, the capital city of Chile, was founded 482 years ago, on February 12th, 1541. It is located in the central zone of the country; its landscape is complemented in the background by the Andes Mountain range. With a Mediterranean weather, it rains only in winter and at a height of 570 meters (1870 ft) above sea level, the city offers the ideal conditions for the high-performance athletes.

By 2023, the Santiago metro will have a layout of 149 kilometers (93 mi) in length, with 143 stations that will go through 28 districts. It will be the second largest subway network in Latin America, and it will connect the Pan American Village (Cerrillos station) with the Estadio Nacional within only 12 minutes. Every official venue in Santiago has a connection to a subway station or is a short distance away by bus.

With a population of 6.1 million inhabitants, Santiago is the largest city in Chile and the sixth in South America.

The currency that we use in Chile is the Chilean peso (CLP). You can also use American dollars (USD) and euros (EUR).

Spanish is the de facto and the administrative language of Chile. A 9.9% of the population speaks and understands the languages of the indigenous people, including Mapudungun is spoken by around 100 thousand and 200 thousand people, Aymara by around 20 thousand, Quichua by around eight thousand people and Rapanui by around 3,300 people.

1.3 The city as the host of large sport events

Chile has been the host of several sports events and international meetings in the last years. The Dakar Rally, between the editions of 2009 and 2015, together with the 2014 South American Games, are some of the examples that show that the country is ready to receive world class events. That is how the country provides its infrastructure and safety.

To become the host of the XIX Pan American Games and the VII Parapan American Games in 2023 is of utmost importance for the city and a country that seeks to celebrate the sports spirit in the Americas, and that aims to leave a legacy of social transformation that promotes an active lifestyle and inspires the society and future generations. In Santiago we are getting ready to welcome 6,932 Pan American athletes that come from 41 countries who will compete in 39 sports and 60 disciplines.

While the Parapan American Games are awaiting the visit of 1,927 athletes from 33 countries in 17 sports and 18 disciplines.

As previously pointed out, Chile was part of the official tour of the Dakar Rally in seven editions, between 2009 and 2015. On the occasion more than three thousand vehicles competed in national territory.

Santiago, together with five sub-venues, organized the South American Games of 2014. In this competition, 4,300 athletes, together with 3,000 volunteers and 400 thousand spectators participated. In 2015 the sub-17 football world cup was held in eight cities of the country. 24 delegations that traveled 63,500 kilometers (39,457 miles) participated along Chile. Another football event of continental relevance was the organization of the Americas Cup 2015, over 650 thousand spectators, more than 3,600 media professionals and over 24 thousand accreditations were considered.

In 2017, Santiago was the location of the South American Youth Games (ODESUR). This event gathered 1,200 athletes from 14 countries, who performed in 21 different disciplines in 18 venues within the city. Our country has experience in large sports events. The Rugby Junior World Cup (2019), the Water Ski World Championship (2013), Polo Championship (2015), Junior Field Hockey World Cup (2016), the Roller Hockey World Cup (2016), the Bolivarian Beach Games (2016), the ITTF World Tour (2016), and the Volleyball South American Championship (2017), highlight the enthusiasm Chile has put into the organization and execution of sports events of international relevance.

1.4 Santiago 2023

Chile will be the host of the Pan American Games for the first time in its history.

1.5 Fiu, the official mascot

Fiu is a Seven-colored tanager bird and was chosen to represent Chile in the Pan American and Parapan American games. Fiu is the sound of its song. It lives in the wetlands of Chile along its territory. Even though it's a small bird, it always gives its biggest effort, the same as every athlete who seeks new challenges every day. Its seven colors mean strength, consistency, respect, determination, honesty, fellowship, and passion.

Fiu's colors, apart from the previously mentioned values, represent the diversity of human beings and species: all the races, languages and beliefs from everyone who will participate at Santiago 2023.

Almost 50 thousand people were the ones that gave their preference to choose the official mascot of the games, an impressive record, since it bested the participation at Guadalajara 2011, Toronto 2015 and Lima 2019.

At first, we received several interesting proposals, but from those we chose five mascots to put up for voting: Fiu, Pewü, Chitama, Juanchi and Santi. Every single one of them had great stories behind them, which were available for the citizens to choose during August of 2021 on the website www.santiago2023.org.

2. COMPETITION-DRESSAGE

The Dressage competition at the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games will take place on October 22nd until October 25th, 2023, at Escuela de Equitación Regimiento Granaderos, located at Larraguibel Avenue, Quillota, Valparaíso, Chile.

2.1 Events and medals

Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be given for all the events of the dressage competition of the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games.

In the Team Event, all 3 or 4 team members will receive a medal.

2.2 Competition format

Equestrian events will be held according to the FEI Sport Rules and FEI General Regulations.

2.2.1 Technical Level

1. MIXED TEAMS – SMALL TOUR / BIG TOUR

A team of 4 (four) can be composed of the following combinations:

- a) 4 (four) Small Tour combinations (not eligible for Olympic Qualification quota place)
- b) 3 (three) Small Tour / 1 (one) Big Tour combinations (not eligible for Olympic Qualification Team quota place)
- c) 2 (two) Small Tour / 2 (two) Big Tour combinations
- d) 1 (one) Small Tour / 3 (three) Big Tour combinations
- e) 4 (four) Big Tour combinations

A team of 3 (three) can be composed of the following combinations:

- a) 3 (three) Small Tour combinations (not eligible for Olympic Qualification Team quota place)
- b) 2 (two) Small Tour / 1 (one) Big Tour combinations (not eligible for Olympic Qualification team quota place)
- c) 1 (one) Small Tour / 2 (two) Big Tour combinations
- d) 3 (three) Big Tour combinations

2. TESTS

There will be two tests according to the technical level of participating combinations:

2.2.2 Tests

Small Tour: Prix St. Georges / Intermediate I / Intermediate I Freestyle

Big Tour: Grand Prix / Grand Prix Special / Grand Prix Freestyle

1. First Day - Individual/Team qualifying competition: All combinations entered.
2. **Second Day - Individual qualifying competition/Final Team competition: all except those under 60 % in Big Tour (Exception from the FEI Dressage Rules – Including the 3% bonus point)**
3. Third Day - Individual Final competition:

The individual final competition will take place on the third day, with the participation of 20 athletes. The 15 highest ranked Big Tour combinations except those under 60% (Including the 3% bonus point). The 5 remaining slots for the highest ranked Small Tour or Big Tour combinations of the Int I or GPS – (the bonus points will count). If there are less than 15 Big Tour combinations entered, all remaining slots will be allocated to the highest ranked Small Tour combinations.

Note: Specific requirements

Degree of Difficulty: DoD will be used for the Grand Prix Freestyle. Athletes are required to login using their own credentials on to <http://dressagefreestyle.fei.org> to create or assign their Grand Prix Freestyle floorplan at the latest 2 hours prior to the draw of the Grand Prix.

2.2.3 Participation

Athletes must be at least 18 years of age in 2023 in order to participate in the Games. Small Tour horses must be at least 7 years of age in 2023.

Big Tour horses must be at least 8 years of age in 2023.

2.2.4 Draw

1. For individuals, it will be conducted as two draws:

- One for the Small Tour and one for the Big Tour.
- The Chef d'Equipe will present their team's starting order, in accordance with current rules.

2. Prix St. Georges / Grand Prix (PSG/GP)

- A draw will be held according to FEI Dressage Rules. Art. 417.4
- The Small Tour combinations will be the first to go in the Team Competition.
- The Chef d'Equipe will determine the starting order of their team members.
- The starting order of the team draw will be kept through both parts of the test (PSG/GP).

3. Intermediate I / Grand Prix Special (Int I/GPS)

- The starting order will be the same in PSG/GP. Therefore, there will be no draw.
- The Small Tour combinations will be the first to go in the Team Competition.
- The starting order of the combinations within a team will be the same as in PSG/GP.
- The starting order of the team draw will be kept through both parts of the test (Int I/GPS).
- All combinations that completed the PSG/GP will be allowed to start in Int I/GPS, except those with a score under 60% (Including the 3% bonus point) in the GP.

4. Intermediate I Freestyle / Grand Prix Freestyle (Int I FS / GPFS)

- A draw will be held according to the FEI Dressage Rules, Art. 417.6
- Adjustments to the starting order will have to be made when the final number of combinations participating in both parts are known.
- Athletes must have obtained at least 60% in Int I or GPS. (Exception from the FEI Dressage Rules 60% - Including the 3% bonus point).
- No more than three combinations from the same country may participate in this competition. In the event that among the top 20 best-placed combinations there are four from the same country, the three best-placed combinations from said country will participate in the individual final. In case one of the three best-placed combinations from said country has a Veterinary or Medical issue, the Chef d'Equipe may substitute the combinations until two hours before the Individual Final Competition. All 4 horses must be accepted at the 2nd Horse Inspection.
- Three medals are allowed per NOC.

2.2.5 Team Scores

- There will be a bonus point of 3% for each GP/GPS combination per team (i.e. a GP result of 60% will be equivalent to 63%).
- The combinations in Small Tour will not receive a bonus point. The drop score will be determined after adding the bonus points to the GP/GPS results.
- If one of the GP combinations obtains the drop score of the team, the bonus point will also be dropped.
- The team results will be determined based on the three best scores of the first test (PSG/GP) and the three best scores of the second test (Int I/GPS).
- The team with the best total team result (whether combined or from Small Tour) will win gold, the second best will win silver and the third best bronze.

2.2.6 Individual Scores

- Combinations participating in the Big Tour will receive bonus points of 3% for the individual qualification. (i.e. a GP result of 60.0% will be equivalent to 63.0% for the individual score).
- The combinations with the best score (Int I FS/GPFS) will win gold, the second best will win silver and the third best will win bronze. If there is a tie for the medals, the Big Tour combination will finish ahead of the Small Tour combination. If there is a tie between combinations in the same tour (Small or Big), the best result in the Int I/GPS will finish ahead.
- Bonus points for the GP/GPS/GPFS will not count toward the Dressage World Ranking, but the GP/GPS/GPFS results count for the Dressage World Ranking.

2.4 Training schedule and venue

The athletes will be able to access the training areas available at the Escuela de Equitación Regimiento Granaderos according to the schedule provided by the Chief Steward.

To guarantee the safety and integrity of all athletes during training, the schedule of training and use of courts will be delivered to the Sports Information Center at the venue.

The day before the first official competition, the Organizing Committee will carry out an official training session (Familiarization) on the field of Play.

2.5 Music presentation and permissions

To confirm that the proper permissions are in place, each athlete will need to have the rights to record their music.

The recordings will be delivered to the Technical Delegate during the second Chef d'Equipe meeting in high quality and in standard digital format. Further details will be provided at the First Technical meeting.

2.6 Qualification system

2.6.1 Quotas

The quota for dressage is 44 athletes.

2.6.2 Athlete eligibility

Athletes must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form. All quotas are obtained for NOCs, not any specific rider.

Athletes must be at least 16 years of age in 2023 to participate in the Games.

Small Tour horses must be at least 7 years of age in 2023.

Big Tour horses must be at least 8 years of age in 2023.

Horse/athlete combination must have achieved at least:

Small Tour - 64% panel score twice from January 1st, 2022, in a CDI or at Games (Central American and Caribbean Games, ODESUR South American Games) at a minimum the same level test. CDI organized must have at least 2 FEI Judges of a nationality other than the Athlete. The two eligibility scores must be obtained at two separate events (Note: The term “event” is to be interpreted according to the FEI General Regulations).

Big Tour - 58% panel score from January 1st, 2022, in a CDI 2* or higher in a GP. CDI organized competitions must have at least 2 FEI Judges of a nationality other than the Athlete and must have been approved by the FEI before the start of the event.

The deadline to achieve the Certificate of Capability is September 24th, 2023.

2.6.4 Confirmation of quota places

The PAEC will confirm to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places that have qualified no later than July 10th, 2023.

The NOCs must confirm to Panam Sports and PAEC the places they will use no later than July 14th, 2023.

2.6.5 Reallocation of unused quotas places

If, until the nominated entries by number deadline, qualified teams or individuals are not entered by their NOC or **do not achieve the minimum eligibility requirement**, the unused quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked team or individual not yet qualified at the Games where the available quota place had originally been obtained. If this is not possible, the quota place will be reallocated in the following order:

1. World Dressage Championship – Herning, Denmark, August 4th – 15th, 2022.
2. South American or Central American & Caribbean Games, depending on the highest percentage scores (Prix St Georges and Intermediate I combined, or GP and GPS combined) obtained by the next highest ranked team or individual not yet qualified.

In case there are still quota places available after the entire procedure above has been applied, NOCs will have the possibility to qualify “composite” teams.

“Composite” qualified teams are made up of minimum three (3) to maximum of four (4) athletes from the same NOC who qualified as individuals as outlined above.

The reallocation of unused quota places must be complete on or before July 17th, 2023.

The NOCs that receive reallocated quotas must confirm their participation no later than July 19th, 2023.

In the event of the cancelation of the CAC Games and/or the ODESUR Games, the NFs participating in each respective Games will be informed of a bidding process to host a Qualifying Competition.

If there are no bids or if the bids do not fulfil the criteria needed to host a Qualifying Competition, the Team and Individual Slots of the respective Games will be reverted to the FEI World Dressage Rankings based on the addition of points of each NOC’s best 4 athletes on the Ranking (or their best 3 athletes if they have only three on the Ranking) taking into account points earned at events held between July 1st, 2022 and June 30th, 2023.

For example, the slots for the CAC Games will be awarded to the best NOCs that were supposed to participate in the CAC Games.

2.7 Qualification Paris 2024 Olympic Games

In Dressage, the best 2 (two) positioned teams and the best 2 (two) individuals (maximum 1 (one) per NOC) who have not yet qualified for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games will obtain direct qualification.

Only Teams with at least 2 (two) athletes competing in Big Tour will be eligible to obtain Team Olympic Qualification.

Only Athletes competing in Big Tour will be eligible to obtain Individual Olympic Qualification.

The Eventing competition at the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games will take place on October 27th to 29th, 2023, at Escuela de Equitación Regimiento Granaderos, located at Larraguibel avenue, Quillota, Valparaíso, Chile.

Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be given for teams and individuals after the jumping test. In the Team Event, all 3 or 4 team members will receive a medal.

3.2 Competition format

Equestrian events will be held according to the FEI Sport Rules and FEI General Regulations.

3.2.1 Competition Format Description

The level of competition for Eventing will be a Hybrid Three Star / Four Star Long (CCI3/4* L) format.

3.2.1.1 Dressage Test

The Dressage Test will be a Four Star (CCI4*)

Level Dressage Test: CCI4* Test B

Competition Arena: 20 m x 60 m

3.2.1.2 Cross-country Test

Cross Country Test will be a Three Star Long Format (CCI3*-L) Level. The Cross Country course will be based on the following CCI3*-L Technical standards:

- Surface type: grass, sand and natural
- Length: min 4400 m – max 5500 m
- Speed: 550 m/min
- Maximum number of efforts: 35
- Maximum height of fixed obstacles: 1.15 m
- Maximum brush height: 1.35 m
- Maximum depth of the highest part: 1.60 m
- Maximum depth of the base: 2.40 m
- Maximum drop: 1.80 m
- Time: min. eight – max. ten minutes

3.2.1.3 Jumping Test

The Jumping Test will be a Four Star (CCI 4*) Level

The Jumping Test is open to all combinations providing that they passed both Horse Inspections and providing that they have completed the Dressage Test and the Cross Country Test.

3.2.2 Individual Final Classification

The individual winner will be the rider who obtains the lowest total penalty points after adding all three (3) tests.

Medals are awarded to the Individual Athletes placed first, second and third. Three medals are allowed per NOC.

3.2.3 Team Final Classification

The winning team will be the team with the lowest total penalty points after adding the penalties of the three highest-placed competitors. For team qualification purposes only, a combination who does not complete the three tests will be penalized 1000 points.

Medals are awarded to each team member having taken part in any of the tests placed first, second and third.

3.2.4 Starting order statement

- A draw will be held to determine the starting order of nations (including those represented by individual riders only) for the first and second Horse inspections. That same order will be used for the teams in the dressage and cross-country tests.
- The order of the Jumping test will be in reverse order of classification after the Cross Country Test.
- The draw will take place before the first Horse inspection and will be attended by the jury, the Technical Delegate and the Chefs d'Equipe. All participating countries, whether in the team or individual category, will be included in this draw.
- The declaration of the starting order will take place after the competitors have inspected the cross-country course and after the first Horse inspection. The Chefs d'Equipe must declare in writing the order and composition of their team members. In case a team is made up of three (3) members, the Chefs d'Equipe will indicate which team space will remain vacant.

3.2.5 Substitutions

After the declaration of the starting order, any change related to the composition of a team or a horse that a competitor is going to ride, must comply with the following:

- The substitution must be made at least two (2) hours before the time in which the first combination performs his dressage test.
- If a rider suffers an accident or becomes ill, he must present a certificate issued by an official doctor of the organizing committee.
- If a horse becomes ill or cannot compete, a certificate/permit must be obtained from the Veterinary Commission.
- Any horse that must be replaced by another already declared must have been presented and approved at the first horse inspection. The Technical Delegate, together with the Ground Jury, must approve said substitution.

All quotas are obtained for NOCs, not any specific rider.

Athletes must be at least 18 years of age in 2023 to participate in the Games.

Horses must be at least 7 years of age in 2023 to participate in the Games.

FEI Eventing Rules will apply in regard to Eligibility and minimum requirements for participation of all Horses and Athletes. Minimum Eligibility Requirement (MER) must be achieved between January 1st, 2022, and September 24th, 2023.

One (1) CCI3*-L MER must be obtained as a combination between January 1st, 2022, and September 24th, 2023.

3.5.4 Confirmation of quota places

The PAEC will confirm to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places that have qualified no later than July 10th, 2023.

The NOCs must confirm to Panam Sports and PAEC the places they will use no later than July 14th, 2023.

3.5.5 Reallocation of unused quotas places

In case there are still quota places available after the entire procedure above has been applied, NOCs will have the possibility to qualify “composite” teams. “Composite” qualified teams are made up of minimum three (3) to maximum of four (4) athletes from the same NOC who qualified as individuals as outlined above. The total number of teams participating in the team competition, including the “composite” teams, may be of maximum 10.

Any team qualified by the principle of composite teams using the reallocation of unused quota places have the right to enter 3 or 4 athletes (depending on if the reallocation of quota gave the NOC a total of 3 or 4 athletes). A team composed of 3 athletes cannot bring a reserve horse even if the reserve horse is paid by the NF.

The reallocation of unused quota places must be complete on or before July 17th, 2023.

The NOCs that receive reallocated quotas must confirm their participation no later than on July 19th, 2023.

Between July 17th, 2023, and September 24th, 2023, if qualified Teams and Individuals are not entered by their NOC or do not achieve the qualification standards, and there are less than 10 teams, or individuals up to a total quota of 46 entered in the competition, the completion of quota from the FEI Eventing World Athlete Rankings will be used. There will be a reserve list.

4. COMPETITION-JUMPING

The Jumping competition at the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games will take place on October 31st until November 3rd, 2023, at the Escuela de Equitación Regimiento Granaderos, located at Larraguibel avenue, Quillota, Valparaíso, Chile.

4.1 Events and medals

Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be given for Teams (after Team Final) and Individuals (after Individual Final) competitions of the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games.

In the Team Event, all 3 or 4 team members will receive a medal.

4.2 Competition format

Equestrian events will be held according to the FEI Sport Rules and FEI General Regulations.

4.2.1 Competition Format Description

The Games comprise three competitions and each taking place on a different day. The team qualification is decided by adding the total penalties incurred in the first competition by the three best combinations in each team and the penalties incurred in each of the rounds (one and two) of the second competition by the three best combinations in each team. The total penalties incurred in each of the first three competitions counts towards the individual classification.

4.2.1.1 Participation

The Games are limited to athletes from the year in which they reach their 18th birthday. The horses must be eight years of age or more.

4.2.1.2 Training Session

The OC, in agreement with the Foreign Technical Delegate, must organize a training session for the Athletes of the Jumping Competitions in the main Competition arena under the following conditions:

- It must take place at the latest, the day before the first official Competition.
- A course consisting of a maximum of ten obstacles, including a combination; maximum height 1.50m.
- Each Athlete is permitted a maximum of 90 seconds per Horse; - dress is informal, boots, breeches, shirt and protective headgear must be worn.
- This training session is open to a maximum of five Athletes and five Horses per team.
- The public may not be charged to enter, and prizes of any kind may not be offered.

4.2.1.3 Official Program

The official program of the Pan American Games will comprise the following competitions: first competition, (individual and team qualifying competition), team competition (it will also count as the second and third individual qualifying competition) and final individual competition.

4.2.1.4 Technical Level

Speed competition:	1.50 mt
Team competition:	1.60 mt
Final competition:	1.60 mt

4.2.1.5 Obstacles

The safety and technical suitability in the design and construction of obstacles must be approved by the Technical Delegate and Course Designer. The Technical Delegate will have the final decision should a dispute arise regarding the obstacles.

The water jump must be used three times in the official competitions at the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games. It will be compulsory in the first and second round of the team competition and in the first round of the individual final. Further use of the water jump will be at the discretion of the Course Designer.

4.2.2 First Competition Day: First Qualifying Competition (Individual and Team)

4.2.2.1 Conduct, table, speed

The first qualifying competition is run over a Table A course judged under Table C (FEI Jumping Rules Articles 239 and 263) and without a jump-off in the event of equality for the first place.

This competition will count as a qualification for the individual final competition. The scores of the best three combinations in each team will be added together.

4.2.2.2 Obstacles, length of course

The course will comprise from 12 to 14 obstacles that include one double and one treble or three doubles. The maximum height for the obstacles will be 1.50 meters with a proportionate spread that does not exceed 2.00 meters (2.20 meters for the triple bar). There must be two vertical obstacles measuring 1.50 meters. Sloping walls will not count as compulsory vertical obstacles. A maximum of two obstacles with a spread of one meter or less may be used. It will not be compulsory to have a water jump. If a water jump is used, it must measure 4.00 meters (including the take-off element) Refer to Art.

4.2.1.5 above.

Length of course: a minimum of 500 meters and a maximum of 600 meters.

4.2.2.3 Participation

The Athletes and Horses included in the declaration of starters for Team and Individual of the Games are qualified to take part in this first Competition.

4.2.2.4 Starting order

The starting order in this competition will be determined by a draw in the presence of the Ground Jury, Foreign Technical Delegate and Chefs d'Equipe, after the Training Session, at a time established by the President of the Ground Jury, in agreement with the OC. The starting order of Individuals and Teams will be drawn under the procedures established in the FEI Jumping Rules Art. 252.

First, a draw for the individual starting places will take place, followed by a draw to decide the starting position of each team. The starting order of team members will be established by the Chefs d'Equipe. The Chefs d'Equipe of teams with only three combinations may determine in which of the three places out of four they will start their combinations.

4.2.2.5 Penalty points

The result obtained by each combination in the First Competition will be converted into penalty points applying the following method: Each combination's time will be multiplied by the coefficient 0.50 to convert it into points; the points must be rounded to two decimal places. The second decimal place will be rounded up from .005 and rounded down from .004. The combination with the lowest number of points after the conversion will get zero penalties, while the other combinations will receive as many points as the difference between each of them with the time of the leading combination. If a combination is eliminated or retires, they will receive 20 points more than those received by the worst-placed combination who has finished the competition (completed the course).

4.2.3 Second Competition Day: Team Final Competition (Also the Second and Third Individual Qualifying Competitions)

4.2.3.1 Conduct, table, speed

This second competition will be conducted in accordance with the Nations Cup rules, except where modified as follows:

This competition will take place over two rounds (Qualifying – Round 1 and Final Round - Round 2) on the same day and over the same course.

It will be judged under table A, not against the clock, with a time allowed at a speed of 400 meters per minute. At the discretion of the Technical Delegate, depending on the size and or conditions of the arena, the speed may be reduced to 375 m per minute.

4.2.3.2 Obstacles, length of course

The competition will include 12 to 14 obstacles, including one double and one treble or three doubles. The maximum height for the obstacles will be 1.60 meters with a proportionate spread that does not exceed 2.00 meters (2.20 meters for the triple bar). A maximum of two obstacles with a spread of one meter or less may be used. There must be at least two vertical obstacles measuring 1.60 meters in height and at least six other obstacles measuring at least 1.50 meters in height. Sloping walls will not count as compulsory vertical obstacles. A water jump with a spread of 4.00 meters (including the take-off element) will be included in both rounds.

Length of course: a minimum of 500 meters and a maximum of 700 meters.

4.2.4 Round 1: Team Competition

Round 1 (Qualifying Round) of the Team Competition will take place on the Second Competition day and will count as the Second Individual Qualifying Competition for the Individual Final competition.

4.2.4.1 Participation

Round 1 (Qualifying Round) of the Team Competition will be open to all riders and horses that have taken part in the First Individual Qualifying Competition.

4.2.4.1 Starting order: Individual and Teams

The starting order for Round 1 is drawn in the presence of the Ground Jury, the Technical Delegate and the Chefs d'Equipe at a time determined by the Technical Delegate and in agreement with the Organizing Committee, after the 1st Competition. The draw of the starting order for individuals and teams will be conducted according to the procedure determined in the Jumping Rules, Art. 252. Chefs d'Equipe of teams with only three Athletes can select in which of the three places, out of four they will start their combinations. Chefs d'Equipe will be able to deliver this starting order after the speed competition, the first qualifier.

4.2.5 Round 2: Team Competition

Round 2 (Final Round) of the Team Competition will take place on the second competition day and will count as the Third Individual Qualifying Competition.

4.2.5.1 Participation

Individual

In Round 2 (Final Round) of the Team Competition, all individuals will start first before Team combinations. All individuals and team members whose teams did not qualify for Round 2 of the Team Competition will take part in this round, provided they have not retired or were not eliminated in Round 1.

Teams

Round 2 (Final Round) of the Team Competition will take place on the same day as Round 1 and will be open only to the twelve best-placed teams and those teams with an equal number of penalties for 12th

place adding the penalties in the First Qualifying Competition and in Round 1 (Qualifying Round) of the Team Competition.

All the teams qualified to compete in Round 2 (Final Round) of the team competition will carry their penalties forward from the First Qualifying Competition and of Round 1 (Qualifying Round) of the Team Competition.

4.2.5.2 Starting order: Individual

The starting order of the individuals and team members whose teams did not qualify for Round 2 will be determined according to the reverse order of the aggregate penalties incurred in the First and Second Individual Qualifying Competitions.

In the event of equality of penalties, combinations will retain the same starting order as in the Second Individual Qualifying Competition (Round 1 of the Team Competition).

4.2.5.3 Starting order: Teams
The starting order of the teams qualified to compete in Round 2 will be determined according to the reverse order of aggregate penalties incurred in the First Individual Qualifying Competition and Round 1 of the Team Competition.

Teams with an equal number of penalties will retain the starting order of Round 1 (Qualifying Round).

4.2.5.3 Team classification

The team classification for the 12 best teams and those with an equal number of penalties for 12th place will be decided by adding the penalties of the three best-placed combinations of each team in the First Competition and in Rounds 1 and 2 (Qualifying and Final Round) of the Team Competition. Teams that do not qualify for Round 2 of the Team Competition will be placed by adding the penalties incurred by the three best athletes in each team in the First Competition and in Round 1 of the Team Competition.

4.2.5.4 Jump-off

In the event of equality of penalties for first, second or third place in the overall team classification, there will be a jump-off against the clock in which all team members may participate.

If more than one jump-off is required to determine the medal placing, the jump-off for third place will take place before the jump-off for first and second place.

The jump-off course will consist of at least six obstacles that may be increased in height and spread, including a combination run at the same minimum speed as Round 2 (Team Final)

The score in the jump-off will be obtained by adding the penalties incurred by the three best athletes in each team. In the event of further equality of penalties, the times of these three combinations in the jump-off added together will decide the winning team as well as the teams in second and third place.

The score of this jump-off is only to determine the placing of the teams and will not count towards the qualification for the individual final competition.

In the event of equality of penalties between various teams for any of the Olympic team qualification places, the same jump-off process will be applied for the allocation of 2024 Olympic Games quota places.

4.2.6 Third Competition Day: Individual Final Competition

4.2.6.1 Conduct, table, speed

This competition will be conducted over two rounds (A and B), each judged under table A, not against the clock, and with a time allowed at a speed of 400 meters per minute. At the discretion of the Technical Delegate, depending on the size and or conditions of the arena, the speed may be reduced to 375 m per minute.

4.2.6.2 Obstacles, length of course

Round A

Round A will include 10 to 12 obstacles, including one double and one treble or three doubles. The maximum height for the obstacles will be 1.60 meters with a proportionate spread that does not exceed 2.00 meters (2.20 meters for the triple bar). A maximum of two obstacles with a spread of one meter or less may be used. There must be at least two vertical obstacles measuring 1.60 meters in height and at least six other obstacles measuring at least 1.50 meters in height. Sloping walls will not count as compulsory vertical obstacles. A water jump must be included and it must measure 4.00 meters (including the take-off element).

Length of course: a minimum of 450 meters and a maximum of 600 meters.

Round B

Round B will have a different course design. It will have eight to ten obstacles, including a double and a treble combination. The maximum height for the obstacles will be 1.60 meters with a proportionate spread that does not exceed 2.00 meters (2.20 meters for the triple bar). A maximum of two obstacles with a spread of one meter or less may be used. There must be at least two vertical obstacles measuring 1.60 meters. Sloping walls will not count as compulsory vertical obstacles. A water jump may or may not be included, but it is possible to include an obstacle if water is used under, in front of or behind it (known as “Liverpool”).

Length of course: a minimum of 400 meters and a maximum of 550 meters.

4.2.6.3 Participation

Round A

Round A of this competition will be compulsory for the 30 best-placed combinations (including those with the same number of penalties for the 30th place), according to the aggregate penalties in the First and Second Competition.

Combinations must have participated in the First Qualifying Competition (completed or not) and must have completed both rounds of the Team Competition (without having been eliminated or having retired). If, for any reason, one or more of the 30 best-placed combinations are unable to participate, they will be replaced by combinations from the reserve list.

No more than three combinations from the same country may participate in this competition. In the event that among the top 30 best-placed combinations there are four from the same country, the three

best- placed combinations from said country will participate in the individual final. In case one of the three best- placed combinations from said country has a Veterinary or Medical issue, the Chef d'Equipe may substitute the combinations until two hours before the Individual Final Competition.

If two combinations tie for third place, the Chef d'Equipe will decide which of the two combinations will participate in the competition. The fourth combination cannot be added to the reserve list but would be eligible as a substitute in case of Veterinary or Medical issue as per the previous paragraph.

The substitution of the 4th combination is allowed only if the 4th combination is among the top 30 best placed combinations and providing the horse in question was accepted in the 2nd Horse Inspection.

Round B

Round B of the Third Competition will be open to the 20 best-placed combinations (including those with the same number of penalties for the 20th place), according to the aggregate penalties in the First and Second Competition and Round A of the Third Competition.

Course inspection for Round B

At the end of Round A, athletes will be invited to inspect the course for Round B.

Starting order: Round A

The starting order for round A will follow the reverse order of the penalties incurred in the First and Second Competition of the Games. In the event of equality of penalties, the same starting order of the Round 2 of the Team Competition will be used to determine the participation order of these combinations. Therefore, the combination qualified in 30th place will start first.

Starting order: Round B

The starting order for Round B will follow the reverse order of the penalties incurred in the First and Second Competition as well as the penalties incurred in Round A of the Final Competition. The combination with the greatest number of penalties will start first, while the combination with the least penalties will start last. The combinations with an equal number of penalties will retain the same starting order as in Round A.

Jump-off

The jump-off will take place over a shortened course of at least six obstacles taken from **one or both** rounds. The starting order in the jump-off will be the same as in Round B.

If more than one jump-off is required to determine the Individual Olympic qualification and, medal placing, the jump-off for the Individual Olympic qualification will take place before the jump-off for third place and for third place will take place before the jump-off for first and second place.

In the event of equality of penalties and time for any of the medal placings after the first jump-off, there will be a second jump-off over the same course. In the event of equality of penalties and time after the second jump-off, the combinations concerned will occupy the same place.

Individual Placing

Individual placing will be determined by adding together the penalties of each combination incurred in the First Competition, as well as the two rounds of the Second Competition (disregarding the penalties incurred in the jump-off if there is one) and Round A and B and, if necessary, according to the penalties and time in the jump-off.

4.4 Training schedule and venue

The athletes will be able to access the training areas available at the Escuela de Equitación Regimiento Granaderos according to the schedule provided by the Chief Steward.

To guarantee the safety and integrity of all athletes during training, the schedule of training and use of courts will be delivered to the Sports Information Center at the venue.

4.5.2 Athlete eligibility

Athletes must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form. All quotas are obtained for NOCs, not any specific rider.

Athletes must be at least 18 years of age in 2023 to participate in the Games. Horses must be at least 8 years of age in 2023.

Athletes and horses, not necessarily as combinations, must obtain a certificate of capability by obtaining a result of not more than eight penalties in the first round of a Table A Competition (FEI Jumping Rules Art. 238 or 273) with a minimum height of 1.50 meters at a CSI/CSI-W or CSIO/CSIO-W outdoor event. Certificates of capability may be obtained between January 1st, 2022, and September 24th, 2023.

4.5.4 Confirmation of quota places

The PAEC will confirm to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places that have qualified through the ODESUR and CAC Games no later than July 10th, 2023.

The NOCs must confirm to Panam Sports and PAEC the places they will use no later than July 14th, 2023.

NOCs must comply with the Deadlines established by Panam Sports by entering their number of athletes and long list by July 20th, 2023, even if they haven't received confirmation of quota from PAEC.

The PAEC will confirm to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places that have qualified through the Ranking no later than August 7th, 2023.

The NOCs must confirm to Panam Sports and PAEC the places they will use no later than August 10th, 2023.

4.5.5 Reallocation of unused quotas places - Teams

If the full quota of 12 teams has not been reached following the reallocation of team quota places as detailed above, any unused team quota places will be reallocated to the best ranked NOC(s) from the Americas based on the addition of points of each NOC's best 4 athletes on the FEI Jumping Pan American Ranking (or their best 3 athletes if they have only three athletes on the FEI Jumping Pan American Ranking), excluding NOCs already qualified with a team, taking into account points earned in Longines Ranking competitions at events between January 1st, 2022 and July 31st, 2023.

4.5.6 Reallocation of unused quotas places - Individuals

If the full quota of 12 individuals has not been reached following the reallocation of individual quota places as detailed above, any unused individual quota places will be reallocated to the NOC(s) of the next best ranked Athlete from the Americas in the FEI Jumping Pan American Ranking, not already qualified with a team or with two individuals, taking into account points earned in Longines Ranking competitions at events between January 1st, 2022 and July 31st, 2023.

If the full quota of 12 teams has not been reached following the reallocation of unused quota places – Teams, then the unused places will be converted to individuals and will be reallocated to individuals (Max 2 per NOC) not already qualified.

The reallocation of unused quota places must be complete on or before August 7th, 2023.

The NOCs that receive reallocated quotas must confirm their participation no later than on August 10th, 2023.

5. PROCEDURES BEFORE AND DURING COMPETITION

5.1 Entries

All countries, through their respective National Olympic Committee (NOC), must send their application for registration in the official format to the Organizing Committee no later than 23:59 hours (Chile Time) on **September 29, 2023**. The format should indicate the sports in which the National Olympic Committee (NOC) will participate.

One reserve combination per team per discipline will be allowed, all costs must be covered by the National Olympic Committee (NOCs).

5.1.1 Numerical Entry

The numerical entry forms, which indicate the number of participants in each individual and team event, without specifying the names, must indicate the number of officials, technical bodies, athletes and delegates that will make up the delegation, must be sent to the Organizing Committee of the XIX Pan American Games Santiago 2023 no later than July 20th, 2023 before 23:59 Chile time, in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations of Panam Sports.

NOCs that have athletes in the “Reserve List” in any of the disciplines must send the numerical entry forms as detailed above in order to be eligible to compete.

In addition to the athletes, each NOC may register: 1 Chef d’Equipe and 1 trainer for each discipline, 1 team veterinarian, 1 groom per horse. If any country requires to register a blacksmith, it must apply to the Organization of the Games through its NOC. In all cases, the number of team officers in a delegation may not exceed 40 per cent, plus 15 per cent paid by the NOC, of the total number of participants from their country in the Games.

Additional accreditation for 1 veterinarian per discipline is only available for NOCs with a full team. The accreditation must be requested in writing to the OC. 2 Horse Owners per horse can be accredited.

5.1.2 Long List

The Long List, Names of Athletes, Team Officials, Technical Bodies, Administrative and Auxiliary Personal who might attend the Games, must be sent by each (NOC) to the Organizing Committee of the XIX Pan American Games Santiago 2023 no later than July 20th, 2023 before 23:59 Chile time.

5.1.3 Nominated Entries

In order for each eligible athlete to participate in the the XIX Pan American Games Santiago 2023, it is required to fill out a Nominal Registration form that must be contemplated by the National Olympic Committee (NOC) and received by the Organizing Committee no later than September 29th, 2023 at 23:59 (Chile Time) in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations of Panam Sports.

Detailed entries with all complete information are required (names of Athletes and Horses). The list of Nominated Entries may consist of double the number of Athletes and Horses than the Definite Entries. (Max 10).

National Federation must complete the FEI Nominated Entries procedure through the FEI Entry System, including the Certificate of Capability submitted to the relevant discipline department, not later than September 29th, 2023 (23:59 Swiss Time)

5.1.4 Definite Entries

National Federation must complete the FEI Definite Entries procedure through the FEI Entry System, not later than October 13th, 2023 (23:59 Swiss Time).

5.1.5 Reserve Combinations

One reserve combination per team per discipline will be allowed, all costs must be covered by the National Olympic Committee (NOCs).

5.2 Anti-doping control and medication control for horses

Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Testing will be conducted in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMR), the FEI Veterinary Regulations and the FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List which shall be in force throughout 2023.

Horses may be selected for testing at any time during the Event Period. The designated FEI Test Veterinarians will communicate with the President of the Ground Jury and the FEI Veterinary Commission. Materials and substances suspected of being used to treat horses in contravention of the FEI Veterinary Regulations may also be subject to testing.

All treatments, except nebulization with non-prohibited substances and fluid therapy, must be carried out within the designated treatment areas according to Chapter 5, 2023 FEI Veterinary Regulations.

5.3 Use of Cameras

Non-professional cameras will not need stickers to enter the venues. If a team wishes to make their own technical recording during competition, this can be done from the athlete and spectator seating area with fan video cameras. Teams can also record during training sessions with fan cameras. Such material may only be used for internal purposes, and not for commercial use.

6. POST-COMPETITION PROCEDURES

6.1 Exit from the field of play

After the athletes leave the Field of Play, they must go directly to the stewards for a boot and tack check.

6.2 Mixed Zone

All competition venues will include a mixed zone, where athletes would be interviewed by accredited members of the media as they leave the competition field. All athletes must go through the mixed zone when leaving the field of play, but they are not required to speak.

When leaving the field of play, the athletes will first pass through the broadcasting area of the mixed zone before reaching the written press area. PIS reporters will also work in the mixed zone to collect feedback from athletes which will then be uploaded to available digital platforms and distributed as flash quotes. These will be available to all people accredited to the Games.

NOC press attachés will be able to meet their athletes on the way to the mixed zone, but this is limited to the press section only. Press attachés must carry the respective identification elements and must respect the agreed standards of conduct.

The mixed zone is located next to the athletes' exit from the main competition field. On the cross-country day of the Eventing competition, the mixed zone will be located just outside the cooling area.

6.3 Kiss and Cry

The Kiss and Cry platform is located next to the athletes' entrance to the competition field. Access to the platform will be limited in accordance with current FWU/FHA policy and will be strictly limited to the period the athlete is on the competition field.

6.4 Medal Ceremony

All medal ceremonies at the SANTIAGO 2023 Pan American Games will take place on the main competition field. Athlete escorts will be available to advise and guide all athletes and appropriate grooms before, during and after the award ceremony.

The FEI Stewards will help the athlete escorts to gather them together with their horses and grooms before the award ceremony.

Athletes participating in an award ceremony must comply with the rules governing both dress and conduct.

7. RULES, PROTESTS AND APPEALS

7.1 Rules

The rules for the equestrian competition at Santiago 2023 must comply with the following documents that will be valid during the Games:

- FEI Sport Rules, Veterinary Rules and General Regulations available at fei.org.
- Panam Sports Regulations.

7.2 Protests

Protests will be made according to FEI Sport Rules and General Regulations.

7.3 Use of brands in sports equipment and clothing

The competition and non-competition uniforms, and sport equipment for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games must comply with the “Panam Sports Games Uniform and Sport Equipment Guidelines”, which follows the requirements of the International Federations of each sport.
