We hope that this guide to Athlete medical services at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games will be helpful. The FEI will be on site with Dr Holger Holtschmit serving as the FEI Paris 2024 Chief Medical Officer and Dr Mark Hart, Chair of the FEI Medical Committee, to assist you during the Games. We kindly request you to provide your medical representative contact information via Hippobase (see Equine Freight Manual), to allow us to create an FEI Medical WhatsApp group for all NF medical representatives. We will use this to share updates during the Games period. We are also planning an informal meet and greet gathering prior to the start of competitions for all NF medical representatives with some of the key venue medical staff who will be available for questions.

Paris 2024 Polyclinic

Location: International entrance to Olympic Village

Transportation from competition sites of athletes to the Polyclinic or referral hospital will be provided by the first-aid ambulances in non-emergency cases and by the SAMU in the event of a major emergency. For non-urgent consultations at the referral hospital or Polyclinic, Paris2024 vehicles may be used to drive patients to these medical appointments.

Polyclinic Services available

During the Games, registered NF doctors may request physiotherapy and other treatments at the competition venue and/or at the Olympic Village Polyclinic

Diagnostic imaging (MRI, ultrasound and radiography as well as lab tests can be done at the Polyclinic (CT-scans are done at the hospital by referral only)

Prescriptions for athletes and accredited members of their delegations

Accredited and registered team doctors will be able to accompany the athletes and members of their delegation to the hospital and, with the patient's consent, discuss their examination and treatment with the attending doctor

Designated Hospital for equestrian athletes and accredited staff

<u>Location</u>: Hospital Bichat 46 Rue Henri Huchard, 75018 Paris (21km from venue, approx. 30-45 min)

Designated athlete access area available during the Games

Return-To -Play (Fitness to compete) Decisions

Paris 2024 medical staff and the FEI Paris 2024 CMO are available to provide advice on an athlete's return-to-play (RTP) fitness. However, the final decision lies with the NOC/NF Team doctor

Non-accredited medical services will have access to the spectators' medical station at the venue
